A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO EDUCATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that some teachers facing
- 2 serious allegations, such as sexual harassment of a student,
- 3 exploit the existing education system by resigning or retiring
- 4 before they can be formally terminated after a completed
- 5 investigation. This practice not only obstructs the pursuit of
- 6 justice but also allows these teachers to potentially continue
- 7 their careers in other states or private schools without any
- 8 consequences. It is imperative to address this critical issue
- 9 within the State's education system to ensure that teachers who
- 10 have resigned or retired in lieu of termination during the
- 11 pendency of the investigation do not retain their teaching
- 12 license.
- 13 The legislature recognizes that it is essential to rectify
- 14 this dangerous loophole. It is unacceptable for teachers
- 15 accused of serious misconduct to evade accountability by
- 16 relocating to different jurisdictions or institutions.
- 17 Requiring these teachers to surrender their teaching licenses

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- 2 of State Directors of Teacher Education and Certification
- 3 database, which maintains an interstate agreement with the
- 4 Hawaii teacher standards board. This, in turn, will ensure that
- 5 potential employers are aware of the unlicensed status of these
- 6 teachers, making it significantly more challenging for these
- 7 teachers to secure employment in any educational setting. This
- 8 Act is a necessary step to preserve the integrity of the
- 9 teaching profession and protect students from potential harm,
- 10 and thus uphold ethical standards and accountability within the
- 11 education system.
- 12 The purpose of this Act is to require:
- 13 (1) A teacher to surrender their teaching license if the
- 14 teacher resigns or retires during the pendency of any
- investigation into allegations of sexual assault,
- sexual harassment, or other physical abuse of a
- 17 student; and
- 18 (2) The surrender of the teacher's license to be reported
- 19 to the National Association of State Directors of
- 20 Teacher Education and Certification.

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- 1 SECTION 2. Section 302A-602, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 2 amended to read as follows:
- 3 "§302A-602 Teachers; licenses and certificates. (a) No
- 4 person shall serve as a teacher in the department without first
- 5 having obtained a license from the Hawaii teacher standards
- $\mathbf{6}$ board in such form as the Hawaii teacher standards board
- 7 determines. The department shall establish types of
- 8 certificates in the educational field and the requirements to
- 9 qualify for those certificates issued to individuals who are not
- 10 required to obtain a license pursuant to sections 302A-801 to
- 11 302A-808.
- 12 (b) Beginning with the 2002-2003 school year, no person
- 13 paid under the salary schedule contained in the unit 5
- 14 collective bargaining agreement shall serve as a teacher in the
- 15 department without first having obtained a license pursuant to
- 16 sections 302A-801 to 302A-808 from the Hawaii teacher standards
- 17 board in such form as the Hawaii teacher standards board
- 18 determines.
- 19 (c) Beginning with the 2002-2003 school year, the
- 20 department may employ unlicensed individuals as emergency hires
- 21 pursuant to sections 302A-801 to 302A-808.

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- 1 (d) If any person paid under the salary schedule contained
- 2 in the unit 5 collective bargaining agreement resigns or retires
- 3 during the pendency of any investigation into allegations of
- 4 sexual assault, sexual harassment, or other physical abuse of a
- 5 student, including criminal and workplace investigations, that
- 6 person shall surrender the person's license. The surrender of
- 7 the person's license shall be reported to the National
- 8 Association of State Directors of Teacher Education and
- 9 Certification."
- 10 SECTION 3. New statutory material is underscored.
- 11 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 3000.

Description:

Requires a teacher to surrender their teaching license if the teacher resigns or retires during the pendency of any investigation into allegations of sexual assault, sexual harassment, or other physical abuse of a student. Requires the surrender of the teacher's license to be reported to the National Association of State Directors of Teacher Education and Certification. Effective 7/1/3000. (HD2)
