## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO SUMMER ELECTRONIC BENEFITS TRANSFER FOR CHILDREN PROGRAM.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECT	TON 1. Chapter 302A, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is

4	SECTION 2. Chapter 346, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is		
5	amended by adding a new section to part II to be appropriately		
6	designated and to read as follows:		
7	"§346- Summer electronic benefits transfer for children		
8	program. (a) Subject to the availability of funds, the		
9	department may implement the federal summer electronic benefits		
10	transfer for children program. To implement the program, the		
11	department shall work with the department of education to		
12	maximize participation in the federal summer electronic benefits		
13	transfer for children program established pursuant to the		
14	federal Consolidated Appropriations Act, P.L. 117-328.		
15	(b) To the extent that appropriations or private funds are		
16	made available, the department may contract with one or more		
17	providers to administer the summer electronic benefits transfer		
18	for children program. Any contract executed pursuant to this		
19	section shall comply with the competitive procurement processes		
20	under chapters 103D and 103F.		

1	(c) The department may accept grants, donations, and		
2	contributions from private or public sources for the purposes of		
3	this section, which may be expended consistent with the		
4	grantors' or donors' wishes."		
5	SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general		
6	revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so		
7	much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2024-2025 for		
8	the summer electronic benefits transfer for children program,		
9	including:		
10	(1) The establishment of one permanent full-time
