

A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO PARKING FOR DISABLED PERSONS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the statewide 2 parking program for persons with disabilities, as established 3 under part III of chapter 291, Hawaii Revised Statutes, pursuant 4 to the federal Uniform System for Parking for Persons With 5 Disabilities, 23 Code of Federal Regulations section 1235, and administered by the disability and communication access board, 6 7 provides individuals with mobility disabilities the ability to 8 travel and park in accessible parking spaces via the use of 9 parking placards. However, improper use and insufficient enforcement impact access for legitimate program participants. 10 11 Therefore, the purpose of this Act is to assure appropriate 12 use of placards by expanding enforcement at the municipal level. 13 SECTION 2. Section 286-119, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 14 amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows:

15 "(a) The examiner of drivers may suspend any driver's 16 license without hearing when the examiner:

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1	(1)	Has reasonable cause to believe that the licensee is
2		incompetent to operate the type of motor vehicle for
3		which the licensee holds a license or is afflicted
4		with mental or physical infirmities or disabilities
5		[which] that would make it unsafe for the licensee to
6		operate a motor vehicle of the type for which the
7		licensee is licensed; [or]
8	(2)	Is notified by the appropriate county director of
9		finance that the licensee has outstanding charges and
10		fines relating to the disposition of an abandoned
11		vehicle, as provided pursuant to section 290-13[\cdot]; or
12	(3)	Is notified that the licensee has violated section
13		<u>291–57(a).</u> "
14	SECT	ION 3. Section 291-57, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
15	amended to	o read as follows:
16	"§29	1-57 Parking spaces reserved for persons with
17	disabilit	ies; penalties. (a) Any person who uses a parking
18	space res	erved for persons with disabilities who:
19	(1)	Fails to properly display a disability parking permit;
20	(2)	Displays an invalid disability parking permit;

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1	(3)	Uses a disability parking permit that was not issued
2		to that person or to any passengers occupying the
3		vehicle in the parking space; [or]
4	(4)	Displays a disability parking permit that was issued
5		to a person who was deceased at the time of the
6		display; or
7	[(4)]	(5) With or without a disability parking permit:
8		(A) Parks in an access aisle; or
9		(B) Obstructs the ingress or egress to a parking
10		space reserved for a person with a disability;
11	shall be	guilty of a traffic infraction under chapter 291D and
12	shall be	fined no less than \$250 nor more than \$500 and pay any
13	costs inc	urred by the court related to assessing the fine;
14	provided	that a person with a disability who has been issued a
15	valid dis	ability parking permit that is currently in effect, and
16	who has f	ailed to display the disability parking permit while
17	parking i	n a space reserved for persons with disabilities, shall
18	pay a fin	e of no less than \$25 nor more than \$100 and any costs
19	incurred 1	by the court related to assessing the fine.
20	(b)	Any person who uses a parking space reserved for

21 $\,$ persons with disabilities and refuses or fails to present an



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1	identification card issued under this chapter or the rules	
2	adopted thereunder to an enforcement officer upon request shall	
3	be guilty of a traffic infraction under chapter 291D and shall	
4	be fined no less than \$250 nor more than \$500.	
5	(c) Any citation issued under this chapter may be mailed	
6	to the violator pursuant to section 291C-165(b).	
7	(d) Upon finding that a person is guilty of, or pleads	
8	guilty to, violating this section, the court shall:	
9	(1) Distribute fifty per cent of the fine imposed upon the	
10	person pursuant to this section to the law enforcement	
11	agency that issued the citation; and	
12	(2) Notify the appropriate county examiner of drivers who	
13	may then suspend or revoke the person's driver's	
14	license in accordance with section 286-119."	
15	SECTION 4. Section 291-58, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is	
16	amended to read as follows:	
17	"[[]§291-58[]] Requirement to provide parking for persons	
18	with disabilities; [penalty.] ordinances to enforce authorized.	
19	[Beginning July 1, 2002, any public or private entity that	
20	provides a parking space reserved for persons with disabilities	
21	shall comply with this part and any administrative rules adopted	

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1	under thi	s part. A private entity that fails to comply with
2	this sect	ion shall be fined not less than \$250 nor more than
3	\$500 for -	each separate offense. Each day of violation shall
4	constitut	e a separate offense. Any action taken to impose or
5	collect-a	ny penalty provided for in this section shall be
6	considere	d a civil action.] (a) Each county may enact
7	ordinance	s to:
8	(1)	Enforce the design and construction requirements of
9		this part, and any administrative rules adopted
10		pursuant to this part, pertaining to the provision of
11		parking spaces and access to parking spaces reserved
12		for persons with disabilities, including but not
13		limited to the number, location, design, and signage
14		of these parking spaces; and
15	(2)	Establish penalties for failure to comply with the
16		ordinances enacted pursuant to this section.
17	(b)	An official appointed by a county may enter the
18	property	of places of public accommodation to enforce any
19	applicabl	e ordinances enacted pursuant to this section.

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1	(c) For the purpose of this section, "place of public
2	accommodation" shall have the same meaning as defined in section
3	<u>489-2.</u> "
4	SECTION 5. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
5	and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
6	SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 3000.



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Report Title: Disabled Persons Parking

Description:

Authorizes the Examiner of Drivers to suspend the driver's license of a person who violates certain regulations relating to the use of disability parking permits. Authorizes each county to enact ordinances to enforce the design and construction requirements for the provision of accessible parking spaces, including the establishment of penalties for failure to comply with the ordinances. Authorizes officials appointed by a county to enter the property of places of public accommodation to enforce violations of the county ordinances. Requires the court to distribute fifty per cent of any fine imposed on a person who violates certain regulations for the use of disability parking permits to the law enforcement agency that issued the citation. Effective 7/1/3000. (HD1)

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
