
A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO PARKING FOR DISABLED PERSONS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the statewide
2 parking program for persons with disabilities, as established
3 under part III of chapter 291, Hawaii Revised Statutes, pursuant
4 to the federal Uniform System for Parking for Persons with
5 Disabilities, 23 C.F.R. 1235, and administered by the disability
6 and communication access board, provides individuals with
7 mobility disabilities the ability to travel and park in
8 accessible parking spaces.

9 The purpose of this Act is to allow a person with a
10 removable windshield placard to be issued a disability travel
11 placard that is valid for a limited period to allow travel off
12 island.

13 SECTION 2. Section 291-51, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
14 amended by adding a new definition to be appropriately inserted
15 and to read as follows:

16 "Disability travel placard" means a two-sided, hanger-
17 style placard issued under this part:



- 1 (1) To a person with a disability who presents proof of
- 2 travel; and
- 3 (2) That expires on the last day of the month following
- 4 the return date."

5 SECTION 3. Chapter 291, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
6 amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
7 and to read as follows:

8 "§291- Issuance of disability travel placard. The
9 issuing agency shall issue one disability travel placard to an
10 applicant who has a valid removable windshield placard and
11 presents a completed form to be provided by the issuing agency
12 along with a copy of the applicant's proof of travel. The
13 placard shall expire on the last day of the month following the
14 return date."

15 SECTION 4. New statutory material is underscored.

16 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 3000.
