### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO HOMELAND SECURITY.

### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. The legislature finds that in order to succeed
 in the responsibilities of the State regarding protection of
 critical infrastructure under chapter 128A, Hawaii Revised
 Statutes, it is necessary to establish protections for critical
 infrastructure information.

6 The purpose of this Act is to establish and specify 7 protections for information that is received or maintained by 8 the office of homeland security for use regarding the security 9 of critical infrastructure and protected systems, analysis, 10 warning, interdependency study, recovery, reconstitution, or 11 other informational purposes.

SECTION 2. Chapter 128A, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended by adding a new section to part I to be appropriately designated and to read as follows:

# 15 "<u>§128A-</u> <u>Confidentiality of critical infrastructure</u> 16 <u>information.</u> (a) Notwithstanding section 92F-11 and any other 17 law to the contrary, critical infrastructure information
