<u>H</u>.B. NO. 2475

A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO COMMERCIAL OCEAN ACTIVITY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The department of land and natural resources 2 (department) division of boating and ocean recreation is 3 responsible for ocean recreation management in state ocean 4 waters, among other responsibilities. Public safety and marine 5 natural resources can be impacted by a variety of environmental 6 factors and emerging ocean recreation technologies, some of 7 which may change rapidly and frequently. This Act is part of a 8 comprehensive ocean recreation management package put forth by 9 the department to ensure effective natural resource protection 10 by providing better management and enforcement tools.

Over the years, over-commercialization of state ocean waters has been unnaturally encouraged via social media and through unpermitted ocean tour operators who advertise and operate without regard for laws, rules, regulations, and cultural awareness. These unpermitted commercial operators set up advertisements and online payment schemes, circumventing

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1 commercial ocean activity laws and restrictions. Subsequently, when attempting to enforce against illegal commercial activity, 2 department staff have oftentimes encountered difficulty in 3 proving that commercial activity or compensation of the alleged 4 5 illegal commercial operator occurred. Many illegal commercial 6 operators and their customers claim that a commercial tour is a 7 "friends and family" outing for no compensation, preventing 8 effective enforcement. 9 Therefore, the purpose of this Act is to update the law defining commercial ocean activities. 10 11 SECTION 2. Section 200-4, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 12 amended to read as follows: 13 "§200-4 Rules. (a) The chairperson may adopt rules 14 necessary: 15 (1)To regulate the manner in which all vessels may enter 16 the ocean waters and navigable streams of the State 17 and moor, anchor, or dock at small boat harbors,

18 launching ramps, and other boating facilities owned or19 controlled by the State;

20 (2) To regulate the embarking and disembarking of
21 passengers at small boat harbors, launching ramps,
22 other boating facilities, and public beaches;

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1 For the safety of small boat harbors, launching ramps, (3) and other boating facilities, and the vessels anchored 2 or moored therein; 3 For the conduct of the public using small boat 4 (4)5 harbors, launching ramps, and other boating facilities owned or controlled by the State; 6 7 To regulate and control recreational and commercial (5) use of small boat harbors, launching ramps, and other 8 9 boating facilities owned or controlled by the State 10 and the ocean waters and navigable streams of the 11 State; 12 To prevent the discharge or throwing into small boat (6) 13 harbors, launching ramps, other boating facilities, 14 ocean waters, and navigable streams, of rubbish, 15 refuse, garbage, or other substances likely to affect 16 the quality of the water or that contribute to making the small boat harbors, launching ramps, other boating 17 18 facilities, ocean waters, and streams unsightly, 19 unhealthful, or unclean, or that are liable to fill 20 up, shoal, or shallow the waters in, near, or 21 affecting small boat harbors, launching ramps, and other boating facilities and the ocean waters and 22

1 navigable streams of the State, and likewise to 2 prevent the escape of fuel or other oils or substances into the waters in, near, or affecting small boat 3 harbors, launching ramps, or other boating facilities 4 and the ocean waters and navigable streams of the 5 6 State from any source point, including but not limited to any vessel or from pipes or storage tanks upon 7 8 land, including: 9 (A) Requirements for permits and fees for: 10 (i) The mooring, docking, or anchoring of 11 recreational and commercial vessels or the

12launching of recreational or commercial13vessels at small boat harbors, launching14ramps, and other boating facilities; or15(ii) Other uses of these facilities;

16 (B) Requirements for permits and fees for use of a
17 vessel as a principal place of habitation while
18 moored at a state small boat harbor;

(C) Requirements governing:

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20 (i) The transfer of any state commercial,
21 mooring, launching, or any other type of use
22 or other permit, directly or indirectly,

1		including but not limited to the imposition
2		or assessment of a business transfer fee
3		upon transfer of ownership of vessels
4		operating commercially from, within or in
5		any way related to the state small boat
6		harbors; and
7	(ii)	The use of state small boat harbors,
8		launching ramps, or other boating facilities
9		belonging to or controlled by the State,
10		including but not limited to the
11		establishment of minimum amounts of annual
12		gross receipts required to renew a
13		commercial use permit, and conditions under
14	*.	which a state commercial, mooring,
15		launching, or any other type of use or other
16		permit may be terminated, canceled, or
17		forfeited; and
18	(D) Any	other rule necessary to implement this
19	cha	pter pertaining to small boat harbors,
20	laı	nching ramps, and other boating facilities
21	bel	onging to or controlled by the State;

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1 To continue the ocean recreational and coastal areas (7) programs and govern the ocean waters and navigable 2 3 streams of the State, and beaches encumbered with 4 easements in favor of the public to protect and foster 5 public peace and tranquility and to promote public safety, health, and welfare in or on the ocean waters 6 and navigable streams of the State, and on beaches 7 encumbered with easements in favor of the public, 8 9 including: 10 Regulating the anchoring and mooring of vessels, (A) 11 houseboats, and other contrivances outside of any 12 harbor or boating facility, including: 13 (i) The designation of offshore mooring areas; 14 (ii) The licensing and registration of vessels, 15 houseboats, and other contrivances; and the 16 issuance of permits for offshore anchoring 17 and mooring of vessels, houseboats, and 18 other contrivances; and 19 (iii) The living aboard on vessels, houseboats, or 20 other contrivances while they are anchored 21 or moored within ocean waters or navigable 22 streams of the State.

1	The rules shall provide for consideration of
2	environmental impacts on the State's aquatic
3	resources in the issuance of any permits for
4	offshore mooring;
5	(B) Safety measures, requirements, and practices in
6	or on the ocean waters and navigable streams of
7	the State;
8	(C) The licensing and registration of persons or
9	organizations engaged in commercial activities in
10	or on the ocean waters and navigable streams of
11	the State;
12	(D) The licensing and registration of equipment
13	utilized for commercial activities in or on the
14	ocean waters and navigable streams of the State;
15	(E) For beaches encumbered with easements in favor of
16	the public, the prohibition or denial of the
17	following uses and activities:
18	(i) Commercial activities;
19	(ii) The storage, parking, and display of any
20	personal property;
21	(iii) The placement of structures or obstructions;
22	(iv) The beaching, landing, mooring, or anchoring

1	of any vessels; and		
2	(v) Other uses or activities that may interfere		
3	with the public use and enjoyment of these		
4	beaches; and		
5	(F) Any other matter relating to the safety, health,		
6	and welfare of the general public;		
7	(8) To regulate the examination, guidance, and control of		
8	harbor agents and their assistants; and		
9	(9) To regulate commercial activities in state waters		
10	including operations originating from private marinas;		
11	provided that no new or additional permits shall be		
12	required for those commercial activities regulated by		
13	any other chapter.		
14	For the purposes of this paragraph:		
15	"Commercial activity" means to engage in any action or		
16	attempt to engage in any action for compensation in any form.		
17	The action or actions may include providing or attempting to		
18	provide advertising or offering or attempting to offer guide		
19	services, charters, tours, and transportation to and from the		
20	location or locations for which such services are provided.		
21	Advertisement or offers in print; by word of mouth; or online in		
22	any form, including through social media, of unpermitted		

1	commercial ocean use activities or commercial ocean recreational			
2	equipment shall be prima facie evidence that:			
3	(1) The owner of the advertised or offered commercial			
4	activity disseminated or directed the dissemination of			
5	the advertisement or offer in that form and manner;			
6	and			
7	(2) The commercial activity is being operated at the			
8	location advertised or offered.			
9	The burden of proof shall be on a person charged with a			
10	violation of commercial activity restrictions under this chapter			
11	or rules adopted by the department to establish that vessels or			
12	equipment, or both, are not being used for unpermitted			
13	commercial activity or that the person's conduct is authorized			
14	pursuant to a permit, lease, or license issued by the			
15	department.			
16	"Compensation" means money, barter, trade, credit, and			
17	7 other instruments of value, goods, and other forms of payment.			
18	"Social media" means any form of electronic communication			
19	through which users create online communities to share			
20	information, personal messages, and other content, offered from			
21	platforms including, but not limited to, Facebook, YouTube,			

1	TikTok, Instagram, Yelp, Tripadvisor, Twitter, Reddit, and
2	Foursquare.
3	(b) All rules shall be adopted in accordance with chapter
4	91 and shall have the force and effect of law."
5	SECTION 3. New statutory material is underscored.
6	SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.

Description:

Includes advertisements and offers in the definition of "commercial activity" as used in chapter 200, HRS. Provides that advertisements or offers for commercial activity are prima facie evidence that the owner disseminated or directed dissemination of such advertisements or offers.

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JUSTIFICATION SHEET

DEPARTMENT: Land and Natural Resources

TITLE: A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO COMMERCIAL OCEAN ACTIVITY.

PURPOSE: To include advertisements and offers in the definition of "commercial activity" as used in chapter 200, Hawaii Revised Statutes (HRS); and to provide that advertisements or offers for commercial activity are prima facie evidence that the owner of the advertisement or offer disseminated or directed dissemination of the advertisement or offer.

MEANS: Amend section 200-4, HRS.

JUSTIFICATION: There has been a rapid expansion of commercial ocean recreational activity within a relatively short period of time, leading to overuse of boating facilities, strain on natural resources, and user conflicts between recreational and commercial ocean users. Many illegal commercial ocean operators claim that their customers are friends and/or family who are not paying for services, which hinders the Department's efforts to enforce illegal commercial ocean activity.

> This bill would expand the definition of "commercial activity" as in chapter 200, HRS, to include advertising or offering to provide unpermitted commercial ocean use activities or commercial ocean recreational equipment. This bill would provide that advertisements or offers for commercial activity are prima facie evidence that the owner of the advertisement or offer disseminated or directed dissemination of the advertisement or offer. The burden would be on the alleged illegal commercial ocean operator to prove that the operator's activities are legal in light of the

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operator's advertisement for commercial ocean activities.

<u>Impact</u> on the public: This bill would help to reduce over-commercialization of ocean resources and allow the recreational public greater enjoyment of state ocean waters.

Impact on the department and other agencies: This bill would provide the Department with more clarity for enforcing commercial ocean activity restrictions.
