A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO MOTOR VEHICLES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. Section 286-136, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 2 amended to read as follows: 3 "\$286-136 Penalty.
