A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO ACCESSIBLE HOUSING.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the Hawaii Data Book 2 estimates that 294,365 residents in the State were sixty-five 3 years of age or older as of July 1, 2022. The legislature notes 4 that many of these residents choose to live in their own homes, 5 otherwise known as aging in place. However, in order for these 6 residents to age in place safely, independently, and comfortably, accessibility modifications in their homes are 7 8 often necessary.

9 The legislature also finds that the State's fair housing 10 laws and the federal Fair Housing Act of 1968, as amended, 11 effectively require certain multifamily housing accommodations 12 to be accessible to, and usable by, persons having disabilities. 13 However, the legislature notes that this requirement is limited 14 to certain housing accommodations that were designed and 15 constructed for first occupancy after March 13, 1991. Thus, 16 numerous multifamily housing accommodations in the State are 17 excluded from these accessibility requirements. Many of these

excluded multifamily housing accommodations are rented by
 disabled and elderly residents who may bear the financial burden
 of installing or constructing any necessary accessibility
 modifications.

5 The legislature believes that establishing a grant program 6 to facilitate the installation and construction of accessibility 7 modifications in rental properties that are not otherwise 8 covered by the State's fair housing laws or the federal Fair 9 Housing Act will allow the State's aging population to age in 10 place more safely, independently, and comfortably. The 11 legislature also believes that the department of health is the 12 most appropriate department to implement the grant program due 13 to the placement of the executive office on aging and disability 14 and communications access board within the department.

Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to establish the multifamily housing accessibility modifications grant program to facilitate the installation of accessibility modifications in certain properties.

19 SECTION 2. Chapter 515, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
20 amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
21 and to read as follows:

1	" <u>§515-</u> Multifamily housing accessibility modifications
2	grant program. (a) There is established in the department of
3	health a multifamily housing accessibility modifications grant
4	program to assist eligible property owners in meeting the costs
5	of installing or constructing, or both, accessibility
6	modifications in multifamily housing accommodations that are
7	exempt from the requirements of section 515-3(a)(10).
8	(b) The department of health may award grants to
9	individuals or families having incomes at or below per
10	cent of the median family income, as determined by the United
11	States Department of Housing and Urban Development, for the
12	purposes of subsection (a).
13	(c) The department of health shall adopt rules pursuant to
14	chapter 91 to carry out the purposes of the grant program.
15	(d) As used in this section, "accessibility modifications"
16	means a structural change made to existing premises occupied, or
17	to be occupied, by a person having a disability or a person who
18	has attained the age of sixty-two years, in order to afford the
19	person full enjoyment of the premises."
20	SECTION 3. In accordance with section 9 of article VII, of
21	the Constitution of the State of Hawaii and sections 37-91 and

1	37-93, Hawaii Revised Statutes, the legislature has determined
2	that the appropriation contained in this Act will cause the
3	state general fund expenditure ceiling for fiscal year 2024-2025
4	to be exceeded by \$, or per cent. The reasons
5	for exceeding the general fund expenditure ceiling are that the
6	appropriation made in this Act is necessary to serve the public
7	interest and to meet the need provided for by this Act.
8	SECTION 4. There is appropriated out of the general
9	revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so much
10	thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2024-2025 to
11	implement the multifamily housing accessibility modifications
12	grant program.
13	The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
14	health for the purposes of this Act.
15	SECTION 5. New statutory material is underscored.
16	SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2024.
