A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO SCHOOL SAFETY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that cardiopulmonary 2 resuscitation (CPR) training and access to automated external 3 defibrillators (AEDs) are essential to school safety at sporting 4 events. Thirty-one states across the nation require coaches 5 receive CPR training. Unfortunately, Hawaii is not one of them. 6 Seventy per cent of students who experience cardiac arrest in a 7 school with an AED survive. This is a significant increase from 8 the average rate of survival. Every minute that passes without 9 AED intervention decreases the survival rate by ten per cent. 10 The purpose of this Act is to mandate that: (1) each 11 sporting event have a CPR trained coach or athletic trainer in 12 attendance and (2) all schools be equipped with AED devices. 13 SECTION 2. Chapter 302A, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 14 amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated 15 and to read as follows:

19	(1)	All divisions and campuses of the University of Hawaii
20		system shall have an automated external defibrillator

1	(c) Beginning with the 2024-2025 school year, the
2	University of Hawaii shall offer a mandatory CPR training for
3	athletic trainers and coaches at the beginning of each academic
4	year.
5	(d) For purposes of this section, "sporting event"
6	includes competitions, scrimmages, and practices."
7	SECTION 5. Section 663-1.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
8	amended by amending subsection (e) to read as follows:
9	"(e) Any person who in good faith, without remuneration or
10	expectation of remuneration, attempts to resuscitate a person in
11	immediate danger of loss of life when administering any
12	automated external defibrillator, regardless of where the
13	automated external defibrillator that is used is located, shall
14	not be liable for any civil damages resulting from any act or
15	omission except as may result from the person's gross negligence
16	or wanton acts or omissions $[+]$; provided that an athletic
17	trainer or faculty member who administers an automated external
18	defibrillator pursuant to section 302A- , 302-D , or 304A- ,
19	shall be considered to be doing so without remuneration or
20	expectation of remuneration.

1 Any person, including an employer, who provides for an 2 automated external defibrillator or an automated external 3 defibrillator training program shall not be vicariously liable 4 for any civil damages resulting from any act or omission of the 5 persons or employees who, in good faith and without remuneration 6 or the expectation of remuneration, attempt to resuscitate a 7 person in immediate danger of loss of life by administering an 8 automated external defibrillator, except as may result from a 9 person's or employer's gross negligence or wanton acts or 10 omissions."

11 SECTION 6. In accordance with section 9 of article VII, of 12 the Constitution of the State of Hawaii and sections 37-91 and 13 37-93, Hawaii Revised Statutes, the legislature has determined 14 that the appropriations contained in this Act will cause the 15 state general fund expenditure ceiling for fiscal year 2024-2025 16 to be exceeded by \$ per cent. The reasons for , or 17 exceeding the general fund expenditure ceiling are that the 18 appropriations made in this Act are necessary to serve the 19 public interest and to meet the need provided for by this Act. 20 SECTION 7. There is appropriated out of the general 21 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so much



thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2024-2025 for the
 purchase of automated external defibrillators and mandatory CPR
 training.

4 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of5 education for the purposes of this Act.

6 SECTION 8. There is appropriated out of the general
7 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so much
8 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2024-2025 for the
9 purchase of automated external defibrillators and mandatory CPR
10 training.

11 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the charter12 school administrative office for the purposes of this Act.

13 SECTION 9. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed14 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.

15 SECTION 10. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
