A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO BURIAL SITES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. The legislature finds that greater clarity and
 efficacy in the implementation of laws regarding historic
 preservation, including burial sites, is needed.

4 Therefore, the purpose of this Act is to clarify statutory
5 language to provide equal protection for Hawaiian burial sites
6 and non-Hawaiian burial sites.

7 SECTION 2. Section 6E-10.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
8 amended by amending subsection (b) to read as follows:

9 "(b) If the board determines that any person is continuing 10 to violate this chapter or any rule adopted pursuant to this 11 chapter after having been served notice of violation, the board 12 shall serve written notice by certified mail or personal service 13 upon the alleged violator or violators specifying the alleged 14 violation. With the notice, the board:

15 (1) Shall order the alleged violator or violators to
16 submit a written schedule within thirty days
17 specifying the measures to be taken and the time



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1 within which the measures shall be taken to bring that 2 person into compliance with this chapter or any rule 3 adopted thereunder. The board shall accept or modify the submitted schedule within sixty days of receipt of 4 5 the schedule. Any schedule not acted upon after sixty days of receipt by the board shall be deemed accepted 6 7 by the board; Shall order the alleged violator or violators to cease 8 (2) 9 and desist from the activities that violate this 10 chapter or any rule adopted thereunder, if that person 11 does not submit a written schedule to the board within 12 thirty days. This order shall remain in effect until 13 the board accepts the written schedule; 14 (3) [May] Shall impose penalties as provided in section 15 6E-11.6; and 16 (4) [May] Shall order the alleged violator or violators to 17 appear before the board for a hearing to answer the 18 charges issued, at a time and place specified in the 19 notice or otherwise set by the board." 20 SECTION 3. Section 6E-11.6, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows: 21



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"(a) In addition to any other administrative or judicial
 remedy provided by this chapter, or by rules adopted pursuant to
 this chapter, the board [may] shall impose by order the
 penalties specified in section 6E-11.5."
 SECTION 4. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
