## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO EARLY LEARNING OPPORTUNITIES.

### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECT	ION 1. The legislature finds that high-quality early
2	childhood	education programs are critical for young children's
3	developme	nt. The legislature further finds that accreditation
4	by a nati	onal organization is one marker of quality in early
5	childhood	education. The legislature also finds that existing
6	service p	roviders unaccredited as of July 1, 2022, who wish to
7	participa	te in the preschool open doors program must achieve
8	accredita	tion by July 1, 2029.
9	Acco	rdingly, the purpose of this Act is to:
10	(1)	Require the department of human services to establish
11		a child care accreditation program to assist licensed
12		and registered child care providers in obtaining
13		accreditation;
14	(2)	Authorize the use of the child care grant program
15		special fund for child care accreditation program
16		grants;

1	(3)	make the accreditation requirement for service
2		providers receiving funds from the preschool open
3		doors program voluntary;
4	(4)	Appropriate funds for the child care accreditation
5		program, including funding for the establishment of
6		one full-time equivalent (1.0 FTE) position; and
7	(5)	Appropriate funds into and out of the child care grant
8		program special fund for the child care accreditation
9		program.
10	SECT	ION 2. Chapter 346, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
11	amended by	y adding a new section to be appropriately designated
12	and to rea	ad as follows:
13	" <u>§34</u>	6- Child care accreditation program; established.
14	(a) The	department shall establish and implement a child care
15	accredita	tion program.
16	(b)	The department shall develop standards, policies, and
17	procedure	s for the administration of the child care
18	accredita	tion program, which shall, at minimum:
19	<u>(1)</u>	Provide upfront grant funding to cover the cost of
20		accreditation by one of the national early learning

1		accrediting organizations, as identified in section
2		346-184(b), or as approved by the director;
3	(2)	Provide grant funding for technical assistance to
4		assist an eligible child care provider through the
5		accreditation process; and
6	(3)	Be available to licensed group child care centers and
7		homes, licensed infant and toddler child care centers,
8		and registered family child care homes.
9	<u>(c)</u>	Requests for grants shall be submitted to the
10	departmen	t in accordance with administrative rules adopted by
11	the depar	tment to administer the grants. Each request shall at
12	a minimum	state:
13	(1)	The name of the child care provider requesting grant
14		funds;
15	(2)	The expenses that are necessary for the child care
16		provider to obtain the accreditation; and
17	(3)	The age range of the children the child care provider
18		serves.
19	(d)	Each applicant for a grant shall provide proof that
20	the appli	cant.

1	<u>( 1 )</u>	Has United States Citizenship or permanent United
2		States resident alien status and is a resident of the
3		State at the time of application;
4	(2)	Is currently licensed or registered as a child care
5		provider, or is an exempt provider approved by the
6		department;
7	(3)	Provides child care at the time of application;
8	(4)	Complies with all other federal, state, or county
9		statutes, rules, or ordinances necessary to conduct
10		the activities or provide the services for which a
11		<pre>grant is awarded;</pre>
12	(5)	Complies with all applicable federal and state laws
13		prohibiting discrimination against a person on the
14		basis of race, color, national origin, religion,
15		creed, sex, age, sexual orientation, or disability;
16	(6)	Agrees not to use state funds for entertainment or
17		lobbying activities;
18	<u>(7)</u>	Allows the department, legislative committees and
19		their staff, and the auditor full access to the
20		applicant's records, reports, files, and other related
21		documents and information for the purposes of

1		monitoring, measuring the effectiveness of, and
2		ensuring the proper expenditure of the grant;
3	(8)	Is not employed by a child care facility that is part
4		of, owned or operated by, or owned or operated as a
5		private educational institution; provided that an
6		organization or individual that owns or operates both
7		a private educational institution and a child care
8		facility may apply only if the organization or
9		individual can provide evidence that the operations
10		and finances of the private educational institution
11		are completely separate from the operations and
12		finances of the child care facility such that it is
13		clear a grant awarded under this section would not
14		support or benefit the private educational institution
15		in violation of article X, section 1 of the Hawaii
16		State Constitution;
17	(9)	Satisfies any other standards that may be required by
18		the source of funding; and
19	(10)	Meets all other standards prescribed in rules adopted
20		by the department to implement the grants awarded
21		under this section.

1	(e) Each child care provider who, after meeting the
2	requirements of subsection (d), receives grant funds from the
3	department shall obtain accreditation and continue to provide
4	child care for years after receiving accreditation.
5	(f) Every request for grant funds shall be submitted to
6	the department on an application form provided by the department
7	and shall at a minimum contain the information required by
8	subsection (d). The department shall review each request to
9	determine whether the applicant is eligible to receive grant
10	funds and shall make a final decision on each request. The
11	department shall inform each grant applicant of the disposition
12	of the applicant's request. The department shall adopt rules to
13	establish an appeals process for any denial of a request.
14	(g) The department shall not release the public funds
15	approved for a grant under this section unless a contract is
16	entered into between the department and the grant recipient.
17	The department shall develop and determine, in consultation with
18	and subject to review and approval of the department of the
19	attorney general, the specific contract form to be used.

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1 (h) Appropriations for grants made under this section shall be subject to the allotment system generally applicable to 2 3 all appropriations made by the legislature. 4 Each grant contract executed pursuant to this section 5 shall be monitored by the department to ensure compliance with this section and shall be evaluated annually to determine 6 7 whether the grant attained the intended results in the manner 8 contemplated. 9 (j) Any grant recipient who withholds or omits any 10 material fact or deliberately misrepresents facts to the 11 department shall be in violation of this section and, in 12 addition to other penalties provided by law, any recipient found 13 to have violated this section or the terms of any contract 14 executed pursuant to this section shall be prohibited from 15 applying for any grants awarded by the department for a period 16 of five years from the date of termination. 17 (k) The child care accreditation program may provide grant

funding to cover incidental expenses to allow a child care

1	(1) The department may contract with a service provider in
2	accordance with chapters 103D and 103F, as applicable, to
3	operate the child care accreditation program.
4	(m) The department shall adopt rules without regard to
5	chapter 91 to administer the child care accreditation program.
6	(n) The department shall report to the legislature no
7	later than twenty days prior to the convening of each regular
8	session with the number and general location of programs
9	applying for and participating in the child care accreditation
10	program, an aggregated breakdown of the type and amount of costs
11	the program covered for providers, and the percentage of
12	providers receiving preschool open doors program funds that have
13	begun the accreditation process or are currently accredited.
14	(o) For the purposes of this section:
15	"Grant" means an award of state funds to a specified
16	recipient to support the activities of the recipient and permit
17	the community to benefit from those activities.
18	"Private educational institution" means a nonpublic entity
19	that provides:
20	(1) Educational services for any grades from kindergarten
21	through grade twelve;

1	(2)	Post-secondary education; or
2	(3)	Pre-kindergarten level services that are provided by
3		an entity that holds itself out to the public as a
4		school or educational institution, or that are
5		identified by the entity as educational services
6		rather than solely as child care services.
7	"Rec	ipient" means a child care provider receiving a grant."
8	SECT	ION 3. Section 346-183, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
9	amended b	y amending subsections (b) and (c) to read as follows:
10	"(b)	The department shall expend moneys in the special
11	fund to a	ward grants to private entities for [the]:
12	(1)	The operating costs of new or existing child care
13		facilities[ <del>, to establish</del> ];
14	(2)	The establishment of new child care facilities[, or
15		<del>for</del> ] <u>;</u>
16	(3)	The expansion of existing child care facilities [+]; or
17	(4)	Child care accreditation program grants awarded
18		pursuant to section 346
19	(c)	[Expenditures] Except for child care accreditation
20	program g	rants made pursuant to section 346- , expenditures
21	from the	fund may be made by the department without allotment."

- 1 SECTION 4. Section 346-184, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 2 amended to read as follows:
- 3 "\$346-184 Preschool open doors program; provider
- 4 accreditation. (a) [Each] Any service provider [of the]
- 5 receiving funds from the preschool open doors program [shall be
- 6 accredited or shall may obtain accreditation [within seven
- 7 calendar years of first receiving any funds from the preschool
- 8 open doors program; provided that any existing service provider
- 9 unaccredited on July 1, 2022, shall commence the accreditation
- 10 process no later than July 1, 2024, and obtain accreditation by
- 11 July 1, 2029; provided further that the director may grant to
- 12 any service provider one or more extensions to obtain
- 13 accreditation on a case by case basis.] pursuant to this
- 14 section.
- 15 (b) Accreditation under this section shall be obtained
- 16 from one or more of the following national early learning
- 17 accrediting organizations:
- 18 (1) National Association for the Education of Young
- 19 Children;
- 20 (2) National Early Childhood Program Accreditation;
- 21 (3) National Association for Family Child Care; or

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1	(4) An accrediting organization approved by the director;
2	provided that the accrediting organization is
3	comparable to the organizations specified in
4	paragraphs (1) through (3).
5	[ <del>(c) Notwithstanding subsections (a) and (b), a service</del>
6	provider may receive or continue to receive funding through the
7	preschool open doors program if the service provider maintains
8	satisfactory performance rating under the Classroom Assessment
9	Scoring System developed by the University of Virginia and
10	performed in conformance with United States Department of Health
11	and Human Services guidelines.
12	$\frac{(d)}{(c)}$ The department shall provide operational and
13	financial support to service providers to assist the service
14	providers in obtaining accreditation. The department may
15	contract with a private entity to assist service providers in
16	obtaining accreditation."
17	SECTION 5. There is appropriated out of the general
18	revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so
19	much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2023-2024 and
20	the same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal
21	year 2024-2025 for the child care accreditation program

- 2 establishment of one full-time equivalent (1.0 FTE) permanent
- 3 position.
- 4 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department
- 5 of human services for the purposes of this Act.
- 6 SECTION 6. There is appropriated out of the general
- 7 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so
- 8 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2023-2024 and
- 9 the same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal
- 10 year 2024-2025 to be deposited into the child care grant program
- 11 special fund established pursuant to section 346-183, Hawaii
- 12 Revised Statutes.
- 13 SECTION 7. There is appropriated out of the child care
- 14 grant program special fund the sum of \$ or so much
- 15 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2023-2024 and the
- 16 same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year
- 17 2024-2025 for child care accreditation program grants.
- 18 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department
- 19 of human services for the purposes of this Act.
- 20 SECTION 8. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 21 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.

1 SECTION 9. This Act shall take effect on June 30, 2050.

#### Report Title:

Early Learning; Preschool Open Doors; Child Care Accreditation Program; Child Care Grant Program Special Fund; Appropriation

### Description:

Requires the Department of Human Services to establish a Child Care Accreditation Program to assist licensed and registered child care providers in obtaining accreditation. Authorizes the use of the Child Care Grant Program Special Fund for Child Care Accreditation Program grants. Makes the accreditation requirement for service providers receiving funds from the Preschool Open Doors Program voluntary. Appropriates funds for the Child Care Accreditation Program, including funding for the establishment of one full-time equivalent (1.0 FTE) position. Appropriates funds into and out of the Child Care Grant Program Special Fund for the Child Care Accreditation Program. Effective 6/30/2050. (SD1)

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
