A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO FIREARMS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the State's gun
- 2 buyback program offers residents a safe way to dispose of
- 3 unwanted or unlawful firearms, including automatic firearms;
- 4 semi-automatic rifles; and unregulated, unserialized "ghost
- 5 guns". The program offers participants up to \$200 in Foodland
- 6 Farms gift cards in exchange for each firearm and allows the
- 7 firearm owner to remain anonymous. The program's goal is to
- 8 allow law enforcement officers to properly dispose of the
- 9 weapons and to reduce the number of firearms in the State that
- 10 could be used for criminal activities. In November 2023, a gun
- 11 buyback event on the island of Oahu collected nearly five
- 12 hundred firearms. The program also offers free gun locks to
- 13 help support the safe storage of guns in the home. The
- 14 legislature believes that the gun buyback program will help
- 15 reduce firearm-related assaults and suicides, and gun-related
- 16 accidents involving children.

- 1 Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to appropriate
- 2 funds to the department of law enforcement for the State's gun
- 3 buyback program.
- 4 SECTION 2. In accordance with section 9 of article VII, of
- 5 the Constitution of the State of Hawaii and sections 37-91 and
- 6 37-93, Hawaii Revised Statutes, the legislature has determined
- 7 that the appropriation contained in this Act will cause the
- 8 state general fund expenditure ceiling for fiscal year 2024-2025
- 9 to be exceeded by \$ or per cent. The reasons for
- 10 exceeding the general fund expenditure ceiling are that the
- 11 appropriation made in this Act is necessary to serve the public
- 12 interest and to meet the need provided for by this Act.
- 13 SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general
- 14 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so
- 15 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2024-2025 to
- 16 support the State's gun buyback program.
- 17 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
- 18 law enforcement for the purposes of this Act.
- 19 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 3000.
