A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO FISHPONDS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Historically, government-owned fishponds were
2	subjected to an extensive permitting process that required large
3	amounts of resources and time to secure. To resolve this
4	problem, in 2015, the department of land and natural resources'
5	office of conservation and coastal lands and other
6	collaborators, including Conservation International Hawaii and
7	Honua Consulting, developed a master permit for traditional
8	Hawaiian fishponds that encompassed the main permits required at
9	that time. The programmatic general permit helped streamline
10	the process for the repair, restoration, maintenance, and
11	operation of traditional Hawaiian fishponds, or loko i'a.
12	Although great progress has been made to streamline the

process remains complex, confusing, and difficult to navigate.

Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to require the

3	SECTION 2. Section 171-28, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
4	amended to read as follows:
5	"§171-28 Government-owned Hawaiian fishponds; sale
6	<pre>prohibition. (a) The board may investigate and develop</pre>
7	scientific commercial management practices for government-owned
8	Hawaiian fishponds and reconstruct, rehabilitate, improve, and
9	stock the fishponds; and expend moneys from the special land and
10	development fund. All revenues derived from any government-
11	owned Hawaiian fishpond shall be deposited in the fund.
12	(b) The board may lease government-owned Hawaiian
13	fishponds with legislative authorization as provided under
14	section 171-53(c); provided that in lieu of legislative
15	authorization, the board may lease such fishponds if:
16	(1) A public hearing is conducted on the proposed lease on
17	the island where the fishpond is located;
18	(2) The board finds that the proposed lease does not cause
19	a substantial adverse environmental or ecological
20	impact on the fishpond or surrounding area; and

1	(3)	The proposed lease is not in violation of applicable
2		federal, state, or county laws.
3	<u>(c)</u>	The board shall implement a standard lease application
4	and progra	ammatic environmental impact statement to streamline
5	the proces	ss of leasing government-owned Hawaiian fishponds,
6	prioritiz	ing projects involving community co-management
7	activities	s, projects, and organizations.
8	[(c)]	(d) Any law to the contrary notwithstanding, the
9	board may	not sell the fee interest in public lands on which
10	government	-owned Hawaiian fishponds are located."
11	SECT	ION 3. (a) The board of land and natural resources
12	shall crea	ate a standard lease application and programmatic
13	environmer	ntal impact statement to streamline the process for

15	(b)	The board shall:
16	(1)	Create a standard lease application that complies with
17		relevant state and federal requirements;
18	(2)	Create a programmatic environmental impact statement
19		for leasing government-owned Hawaiian fishponds;
20	(3)	Study the feasibility of either establishing a full-
21		time permanent staff position to assist lease

7	(c)	The board of land and natural resources shall consult
8	with indu	stry stakeholders and other Native Hawaiian
9	organizat	ions, who are encouraged to cooperate and provide
10	informati	on or input.
11	(d)	The board of land and natural resources may request
12	assistanc	e and feedback from the United States National Oceanic
13	and Atmos	pheric Administration, department of land and natural
14	resources	, department of the attorney general, and any other
15	departmen	t that the board deems appropriate, to provide
16	expertise	in establishing the standard lease application and

18	SECT	ION 4. There is appropriated out of the general
19	revenues	of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so
20	much there	eof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2023-2024 to
21	create a	standard lease application and programmatic

- 3 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
- 4 land and natural resources for the purposes of this Act.
- 5 SECTION 5. In accordance with section 9 of article VII of
- 6 the Hawaii State Constitution and sections 37-91 and 37-93,
- 7 Hawaii Revised Statutes, the legislature has determined that the
- 8 appropriations contained in H.B. No. , will cause the state
- 9 general fund expenditure ceiling for fiscal year 2024-2025 to be
- 10 exceeded by \$ or per cent. In addition, the
- 11 appropriation contained in this Act will cause the general fund
- 12 expenditure ceiling for fiscal year 2024-2025 to be further
- 13 exceeded by \$ or per cent. The combined total
- 14 amount of general fund appropriations contained in only these
- 15 two Acts will cause the state general fund expenditure ceiling
- 16 for fiscal year 2024-2025 to be exceeded by
- 17 \$ or per cent. The reasons for exceeding the
- 18 general fund expenditure ceiling are that:
- 19 (1) The appropriation made in this Act is necessary to
- 20 serve the public interest; and

1	(2) The appropriation made in this Act meets the needs
2	addressed by this Act.
3	SECTION 6. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
4	and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
5	SECTION 7. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2024.
