### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO INVASIVE SPECIES.

### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. The legislature finds that albizia trees are an
invasive species that continues to present a threat to life,
property, public roads, and utility infrastructure in Hawaii.
The legislature also finds that albizia trees are more likely
than many other species of trees of comparable size to fall or
break in windy, rainy, or stormy weather conditions.

7 In natural disaster situations such as the one created by 8 tropical storm Iselle when it struck the Puna district on the 9 island of Hawaii in 2020, and the Kona storms in 2021, fallen or 10 broken albizia trees may threaten public safety by blocking 11 evacuation routes; damaging homes; downing utility lines; or 12 impeding access to emergency care facilities, schools, and 13 polling places. Furthermore, the speed and manner in which 14 albizia trees grow inhibit the growth and health of native 15 plants. As such, the legislature finds that removal of albizia 16 trees along public roadways and the rights of way for public 17 utilities is in the public interest.

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The purpose of this Act is to appropriate funds for the
removal of albizia and other invasive trees that potentially
threaten public roadways and utility infrastructure rights of
way on public and private land; provided that the funds are
matched by a public utility.

6 SECTION 2. There is appropriated out of the general 7 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$1,000,000 or so much 8 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2024-2025 for the 9 department of transportation to coordinate the removal of 10 albizia and other invasive trees that potentially threaten 11 public roadways and utility infrastructure rights of way on 12 public and private land; provided that no funds shall be made 13 available under this Act unless a public utility provides 14 matching funds.

15 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of 16 transportation for the purposes of this Act.

SECTION 3. The appropriation made by this Act shall not lapse at the end of the fiscal biennium for which the appropriation is made; provided that all moneys from the appropriation unencumbered as of June 30, 2026, shall lapse as of that date.

1	SECTION 4. In accordance with section 9 of article VII of
2	the Hawaii State Constitution and sections 37-91 and 37-93,
3	Hawaii Revised Statutes, the legislature has determined that the
4	appropriations contained in H.B. No. , will cause the state
5	general fund expenditure ceiling for fiscal year 2024-2025 to be
6	exceeded by \$ or per cent. In addition, the
7	appropriation contained in this Act will cause the general fund
8	expenditure ceiling for fiscal year 2024-2025 to be further
9	exceeded by \$ or per cent. The combined total
10	amount of general fund appropriations contained in only these
11	two Acts will cause the state general fund expenditure ceiling
12	for fiscal year 2024-2025 to be exceeded by
13	\$ or per cent. The reasons for exceeding the
14	general fund expenditure ceiling are that:
15	(1) The appropriation made in this Act is necessary to
16	serve the public interest; and
17	(2) The appropriation made in this Act meets the needs
18	addressed by this Act.
19	SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 3000.
