A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO LAHAINA WILDFIRE RECOVERY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the August 2023 Maui
- 2 wildfires destroyed more than two thousand homes and more than
- 3 eight hundred places of business. Property damage has been
- 4 estimated at \$6,000,000,000, and lost business revenue has been
- 5 estimated at \$2,700,000 per day. Recovery is expected to take
- 6 five to ten years.
- 7 The legislature further finds that establishing a
- 8 commission to oversee the recovery process, understand the
- 9 entirety of the recovery, accept input from the public, and
- 10 provide a public-facing entity for recovery efforts will help to
- 11 ensure that the recovery efforts consider the needs of all
- 12 individuals involved.
- Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to establish a
- 14 commission to provide a comprehensive and integrated vision of
- 15 the 2023 Lahaina wildfire recovery. The legislature does not
- 16 intend for this commission to take the place of a regular

1	information source for the community and government but instead
2	provide:
3	(1) A public-facing entity that will simultaneously gather
4	and disseminate information significant to the
5	wildfire victims and the State at large, as recovery
6	efforts proceed; and
7	(2) A conduit through which community-initiated guidance
8	on the recovery efforts may be communicated to the
9	public agencies conducting the recovery, remediation,
10	and restoration activities.
11	SECTION 2. (a) There is established the Lahaina recovery
12	oversight commission within the department of accounting and
13	general services for administrative purposes. The purpose of
14	the Lahaina recovery oversight commission shall be to oversee,
15	report on, and guide the efforts taken to rebuild Lahaina, Maui,
16	from the damages caused by the 2023 Lahaina wildfire.
17	(b) The commission shall consist of the following
18	individuals, who shall serve as voting members:
19	(1) A member of the senate who represents the senate

district that includes Lahaina;

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1	(2)	A member of the house of representatives who	
2		represents the house district that includes Lahaina;	
3	(3)	The mayor of Maui county, or the mayor's designee;	
4	(4)	An individual designated by the mayor of Maui county;	
5	(5)	Two members of the Maui county council, to be	
6		designated by the Maui county council chair; one of	
7		whom shall be from the west Maui district;	
8	(6)	The superintendent of education, or the	
9		superintendent's designee;	
10	(7)	The comptroller, or the comptroller's designee;	
11	(8)	The director of business, economic development, and	
12		tourism, or the director's designee;	
13	(9)	Three individuals designated by the speaker of the	
14		house of representatives who were residents of	
15		Lahaina, Maui, at the time of the 2023 Lahaina	
16		wildfire event; and	
17	(10)	Three individuals designated by the president of the	
18		senate who were residents of Lahaina, Maui, at the	
19		time of the 2023 Lahaina wildfire event.	
20	(c)	The state disaster recovery coordinator shall serve as	
21	a nonvoting member of the commission.		

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- 1 (d) The commission shall select a chair from among its
- 2 members. The commission may establish working groups.
- 3 (e) The commission shall invite members of the community;
- 4 relevant for-profit and nonprofit entities; and relevant
- 5 federal, state, and Maui county agencies and departments to
- 6 participate in the public meetings of the commission.
- 7 (f) The members of the commission shall serve without
- 8 compensation but shall be reimbursed for expenses, including
- 9 reasonable travel expenses, necessary for the performance of
- 10 their duties.
- 11 (g) No later than December 31, 2024, the commission shall
- 12 establish standards for the recovery, including identifying
- 13 relevant issues for analysis; establishing goals for rebuilding
- 14 Lahaina, Maui; and drafting metrics to measure progress toward
- 15 achieving the goals. The commission shall consult with the
- 16 community and policy leaders in developing the standards and
- 17 metrics required by this subsection.
- (h) With the assistance of the office of enterprise
- 19 technology services, the commission shall establish a website to
- 20 serve as a clearinghouse for information related to the 2023

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- 1 Lahaina wildfire recovery. The website shall also accept
- 2 comments and other input from the public regarding the recovery.
- 3 (i) The commission's proceedings shall be subject to
- 4 chapter 92, Hawaii Revised Statutes.
- 5 (j) No later than twenty days before the convening of the
- 6 regular sessions of 2026, 2027, 2028, 2029, and 2030, the
- 7 commission shall submit an annual report to the legislature
- 8 regarding the recovery of Lahaina, Maui, on the following
- 9 matters:
- 10 (1) The status of rebuilding housing, educational
- facilities, and community facilities;
- 12 (2) The efforts taken for environmental restoration;
- 13 (3) The status of infrastructure restoration;
- 14 (4) Whether the well-being and other needs of impacted
- Maui residents have been addressed;
- 16 (5) The progress toward reaching the standards and goals
- established pursuant to subsection (g); and
- 18 (6) Findings, recommendations, and any proposed
- 19 legislation.
- 20 (k) The commission shall cease to exist on June 30, 2030.

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1 SECTION 3. In accordance with section 9 of article VII, of 2 the Constitution of the State of Hawaii and sections 37-91 and 37-93, Hawaii Revised Statutes, the legislature has determined 3 that the appropriation contained in this Act will cause the 4 5 state general fund expenditure ceiling for fiscal year 2024-2025 to be exceeded by \$, or per cent. The reasons 6 7 for exceeding the general fund expenditure ceiling are that the appropriation made in this Act is necessary to serve the public 8 9 interest and to meet the needs provided for by this Act. SECTION 4. There is appropriated out of the general 10 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ 11 or so 12 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2024-2025 for 13 the Lahaina recovery oversight commission. 14 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of

accounting and general services for the purposes of this Act.

SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2112.

Description:

Establishes the Lahaina Recovery Oversight Commission within the Department of Accounting and General Services to oversee and guide the recovery of Lahaina from the 2023 wildfires. Requires the Commission, with the assistance of the Office of Enterprise Technology Services, to establish a website to serve as an information clearing house and public forum. Requires annual reports to the Legislature. Appropriates moneys. Declares that the general fund expenditure ceiling is exceeded. Takes effect 7/1/2112. (SD1)

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
