A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO REHABILITATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The purpose of this Act is to require the
- 2 department of health to establish or contract with behavioral
- 3 health crisis centers to provide intervention and stabilization
- 4 services in each county for persons experiencing a mental
- 5 illness or substance use disorder crisis.
- 6 SECTION 2. Chapter 334, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 7 amended by adding a new section to part I to be appropriately
- 8 designated and to read as follows:
- 9 "\$334- Behavioral health crisis centers. (a) Pursuant
- 10 to the authority and functions established under sections
- 334-2.5(a)(3)(B) and 334-3(a)(5), the director shall establish
- 12 or contract with behavioral health crisis centers in each county
- 13 of the State to provide care, diagnosis, or treatment for
- 14 persons experiencing a mental illness or substance use disorder
- 15 crisis.
- 16 (b) Each behavioral health crisis center established or
- 17 contracted with pursuant to this section shall:



1	(1)	Be designed to:
2		(A) Address mental illness and substance use disorder
3		crisis issues; and
4		(B) Screen, assess, admit for stabilization, and
5		redirect a client to ongoing care in the most
6		appropriate and least restrictive community
7		setting available, consistent with the client's
8		needs;
9	(2)	Provide services twenty-four hours a day, seven days a
10		week;
11	<u>(3)</u>	Accept all walk-ins and referrals and provide services
12		regardless of the client's ability to pay, subject to
13		subsection (c);
14	(4)	Offer a dedicated first responder drop-off area;
15	(5)	Not require medical clearance before admission of the
16		client but rather provide assessment and support for
17		the client's medical stability while at the crisis
18		center;
19	(6)	Have the capacity to assess physical health needs and
20		deliver care for most minor physical health
21		challenges;

1	<u>(7)</u>	Be staffed at all times with a multidisciplinary team
2		capable of meeting the needs of clients experiencing
3		all levels of mental illness or substance use disorder
4		crises, including:
5		(A) Psychiatrists or advanced practice registered
6		nurses with psychiatric specialization;
7		(B) Nurses;
8		(C) Licensed or credentialed clinicians capable of
9		completing assessments of the client; and
10		(D) Peers with lived experience similar to the
11		experience of the client; and
12	(8)	Screen clients for risk of suicide and violence and
13		complete more comprehensive risk assessments and
14		planning when clinically indicated.
15	<u>(c)</u>	No person shall be denied services or receive delayed
16	services	at a behavioral health crisis center operating under
17	this sect	ion because of inability to pay; provided that, subject
18	to sectio	n 334-6, crisis centers shall make every reasonable
19	effort to	collect appropriate reimbursement for the cost of
20	providing	services to persons able to pay for services,
21		insurance or third-party payments.

1 (d) The director shall adopt rules pursuant to section 2 334-9 to implement this section, including rules specifying 3 standards for behavioral health crisis center eligibility 4 criteria, clinical procedures, staffing requirements, and operational, administrative, and financing requirements." 5 6 SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general 7 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2024-2025 for 8 9 the director of health to establish or contract with behavioral 10 health crisis centers pursuant to this Act. 11 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of 12 health for the purposes of this Act. 13 SECTION 4. In accordance with section 9 of article VII of 14 the Hawaii State Constitution and sections 37-91 and 37-93, 15 Hawaii Revised Statutes, the legislature has determined that the appropriations contained in H.B. No. , will cause the state 16 17 general fund expenditure ceiling for fiscal year 2024-2025 to be 18 exceeded by \$ per cent. In addition, the or 19 appropriation contained in this Act will cause the general fund 20 expenditure ceiling for fiscal year 2024-2025 to be further 21 exceeded by \$ or per cent. The combined total

1	amount of general fund appropriations contained in only these
2	two Acts will cause the state general fund expenditure ceiling
3	for fiscal year 2024-2025 to be exceeded by
4	\$ or per cent. The reasons for exceeding the
5	general fund expenditure ceiling are that:
6	(1) The appropriation made in this Act is necessary to
7	serve the public interest; and
8	(2) The appropriation made in this Act meets the needs
9	addressed by this Act.
10	SECTION 5. New statutory material is underscored.
11	SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect upon its approval;
12	provided that section 3 shall take effect on July 1, 2024.
