#### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE LEGISLATURE.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that work-related travel 2 is necessary for legislative members, both during and between 3 legislative sessions. Legislative members, especially members from neighbor islands, incur substantial travel expenses, 4 5 lodging expenses, and other costs while representing their 6 constituents. While some state employers, including the university of Hawaii, reimburse travel expenses at federally 7 8 determined rates, the current per diem rate for legislators 9 falls far below federal guidelines. To provide housing equity 10 and fair treatment, and to allow members to represent their 11 constituents effectively, the legislature believes that 12 out-of-district travel for all legislative members should be 13 reimbursed at rates established by the general services 14 administration and defense travel management office, no more and 15 no less.

The legislature also believes that legislative members from

neighbor islands may more effectively represent their districts

- 1 if the members are able to be present on the island of Oahu as
- 2 often as needed, including during legislative interims. To
- 3 provide housing equity with other agencies, and to support the
- 4 legislators' necessary presence at the capitol, legislators from
- 5 neighbor islands who maintain a residence on Oahu should be
- 6 provided a basic housing allowance at the standard federal per
- 7 diem rate, no more and no less.
- 8 Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to require all
- 9 travel and lodging expenses for legislative members to be
- 10 reimbursed at federally determined rates, including:
- 11 (1) Out-of-district travel expenses for all legislative
- 12 members; and
- 13 (2) Basic housing expenses for non-Oahu legislative
- members.
- 15 SECTION 2. Chapter 24, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended
- 16 by adding a new section to be appropriately designated and to
- 17 read as follows:
- 18 "§24- Basic housing allowance for a non-Oahu
- 19 legislator. A member of the legislature whose legal residence
- 20 is on an island other than the island of Oahu shall receive a
- 21 basic housing allowance, paid both during session and during

1 interim, and set at a rate equal to the maximum per diem rate for lodging established by the Defense Travel Management 3 Office." 4 SECTION 3. Section 24-2, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended to read as follows: 5 6 "§24-2 Allowance for a non-Oahu legislator during session. 7 (a) A member of the legislature whose legal residence is on an 8 island other than the island of Oahu shall receive an additional allowance to cover all personal expenses [such as board, 10 lodging,] and incidental expenses [but not travel expenses]. 11 The allowance under this section shall be set at a single rate 12 that will[÷ 13 (1) Not exceed the greater of] be equal to the maximum 14 allowance for [such] similar expenses payable to any public officer or employee of the federal government 15 16 [or the State; 17 (2) Be reasonably calculated to cover the expenses 18 specified in this section; and 19 (3) Be determined jointly by the president of the senate 20 and the speaker of the house of representatives for 21 the legislature as a whole].

1 (b) The allowance shall be paid to each member at the rate prescribed for each day, from the first to the last day of each 2 3 session, including Saturdays, Sundays, holidays, and days of 4 recess pursuant to the mandatory recess required by article III, 5 section 10, of the Constitution or a concurrent resolution, 6 except for days of recess when a session of the legislature is 7 recessed for more than three days pursuant to a concurrent 8 resolution and for days of unexcused absence of the member from a meeting of the respective house." SECTION 4. Section 24-3, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 10 11 amended to read as follows: 12 "\$24-3 Allowance for expenses while traveling on official 13 legislative business during a session within the State. A 14 member of the legislature whose legal residence is on the island 15 of Oahu and who is required to remain away from the island of 16 the member's legal residence but within the State overnight or 17 longer while on official legislative business during a session 18 and when authorized by the presiding officer of the respective 19 house, shall receive an allowance to cover all personal expenses such as board, lodging, and incidental expenses [but not travel 20

2	single rate that will[÷

4	allowance for [such] similar expenses payable to any

12	SECTION 5. Section 24-4, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
13	amended to read as follows:
14	"§24-4 Allowance for expenses while on official
15	legislative business during period of recess and interim
16	official legislative business. When a session of the
17	legislature is recessed for more than three days pursuant to a
18	concurrent resolution or for any interim official legislative
19	business, a member of the legislature while on official
20	legislative business on the island of the member's legal
21	residence and when authorized by the presiding officer of the

1 respective house, shall receive an allowance of \$10 a day to 2 cover personal expenses. 3 When a session of the legislature is recessed for more than three days pursuant to the mandatory recess required by 4 5 article III, section 10, of the Constitution or a concurrent 6 resolution or for any interim official legislative business, a 7 member of the legislature who is required to remain away from 8 the island of the member's legal residence but within the State 9 overnight or longer while on official legislative business and 10 when authorized by the presiding officer of the respective house, shall receive an allowance to cover all personal expenses 11 12 [such as board, lodging,] and incidental expenses [but not 13 travel expenses]. The allowance under this section shall be set 14 at a single rate that will[+ 15 (1) Not exceed the greater of be equal to the maximum 16 allowance for [such] similar expenses payable to any **17** public officer or employee of the federal government 18 [or the State; 19 (2) Be reasonably calculated to cover the expenses 20 specified in this section; and

1	(3) Be determined jointly by the president of the senate
2	and the speaker of the house of representatives for
3	the legislature as a whole]."
4	SECTION 6. In accordance with section 9 of article VII, of
5	the Constitution of the State of Hawaii and sections 37-91 and
6	37-93, Hawaii Revised Statutes, the legislature has determined
7	that the appropriations contained in this Act will cause the
8	state general fund expenditure ceiling for fiscal year 2024-2025
9	to be exceeded by \$ , or per cent. The reasons
10	for exceeding the general fund expenditure ceiling are that the
11	appropriations made in this Act are necessary to serve the
12	public interest and to meet the need provided for by this Act.
13	SECTION 7. There is appropriated out of the general
14	revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so
15	much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2024-2025 to
16	carry out the purposes of this Act.
17	The sum appropriated shall be expended by the senate for
18	the purposes of this Act.
19	SECTION 8. There is appropriated out of the general
20	revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so

- much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2024-2025 to
- 2 carry out the purposes of this Act.
- 3 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the house of
- representatives for the purposes of this Act.
- 5 SECTION 9. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 6 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 7 SECTION 10. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2024.

Requires all travel and lodging expenses for legislative members to be reimbursed at federally determined rates. Establishes a basic housing allowance for non-Oahu legislative members. Appropriates moneys. Declares that the appropriation exceeds the state general fund expenditure ceiling for 2024-2025.
