H.B. NO. 2726

A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE RESIDENTIAL LANDLORD-TENANT CODE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. The legislature finds that residential tenants
 may be vulnerable to landlords who violate the State's
 residential landlord-tenant code. Tenants who have been
 subjected to unfair or unlawful treatment may find themselves
 unable to protect their rights without initiating expensive
 lawsuits.

7 Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to provide more 8 legal protections for residential tenants by allowing tenants 9 who prevail in a lawsuit for a violation of the residential 10 landlord-tenant code to be awarded reasonable attorney's fees, 11 costs, and threefold damages.

SECTION 2. Chapter 521, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended by adding a new section to part VI to be appropriately designated and to read as follows:
