A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO HEALTHCARE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that Hawaii's residents 2 deserve universal and equitable access to affordable, 3 high-quality healthcare. The Hawaii Prepaid Health Care Act, 4 enacted in 1974; state health insurance program, enacted in 5 1989; and the State's successful medquest program are examples 6 of Hawaii's tradition of innovation in healthcare system reform. 7 However, further reforms are needed to address current gaps in 8 residents' access to healthcare and health insurance. In 2024, 9 approximately eighty thousand Hawaii residents are uninsured. 10 The legislature recognizes that many of the State's 11 residents face numerous barriers to accessing healthcare and 12 health insurance. These include high insurance costs for 13 individuals and employers; confusing regulatory and 14 administrative requirements; clear disparities in health 15 outcomes and quality of care; and growing stresses on the 16 healthcare workforce. Addressing these barriers requires the 17 State to make a renewed commitment to guaranteeing universal

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2 administrative costs, and modernizing Hawaii's health system. 3 The legislature also recognizes that the state health 4 planning and development agency was established to administer state health planning and cost containment activities. 5 The 6 agency is also the designated recipient of the data necessary to 7 understand healthcare costs, quality of care issues, community 8 health conditions, and healthcare disparities. 9 Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to establish a task 10 force, known as Hui Hoomana, to identify actionable priorities 11 and financial resources to offer the State's residents universal 12 and equitable access to affordable, high-quality healthcare and 13 health insurance. 14 SECTION 2. (a) There is established the Hui Hoomana task 15 force, to be led by the state health planning and development 16 agency in coordination with the department of health, department 17 of human services, and insurance commissioner. The task force 18 shall comprise the following voting members; provided that 19 non-governmental members shall be invited by the chair of the

2		Association, or the chief executive officer's
3		designee;
4	(10)	The executive director of the Hawaii Medical
5		Association, or the executive director's designee;
6	(11)	The president of the Hawaii Nurses' Association, or
7		the president's designee;
8	(12)	The president and chief executive officer of The
9		Queen's Health System, or the president and chief
10		executive officer's designee;
11	(13)	The president and chief executive officer of Hawaii
12		Pacific Health, or the president and chief executive
13		officer's designee;
14	(14)	The president and chief executive officer of the
15		Hawaii Health Systems Corporation, or the president
16		and chief executive officer's designee;
17	(15)	The chair and president of the Accountable Health Care
18		Alliance of Rural Oahu, or the chair and president's
19		designee;
20	(16)	The chief executive officer of Papa Ola Lokahi, or the
21		chief executive officer's designee;

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1	(17)	The chief executive officer of AlohaCare, or the chief
2		executive officer's designee;
3	(18)	The administrator of the Hawaii Employer-Union Health
4		Benefits Trust Fund, or the administrator's designee;
5	(19)	The state director of AARP Hawaii, or the state
6		director's designee;
7	(20)	The dean of the university of Hawaii John A. Burns
8		school of medicine, or the dean's designee;
9	(21)	The president of the Hawaii Pharmacists Association,
10		or the president's designee; and
11	(22)	One member from each county, to be selected by the
12		county's respective mayor.
13	(b)	The following shall serve as non-voting, ex-officio
14	members:	
15	(1)	The governor's chief of staff, or the chief of staff's
16		designee;
17	(2)	The chair of the senate committee on health and human
18		services, or the chair's designee;
19	(3)	The chair of the house of representatives committee on
20		health and homelessness, or the chair's designee;

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1	(4)	Two members selected by the state health planning and
2		development agency from its statewide health
3		coordinating council or its plan development
4		committee;
5	(5)	The director of public safety, or the director's
6		designee;
7	(6)	One member from the department of health's office of
8		primary care and rural health, selected by the
9		director of health;
10	(7)	The administrator of the executive office on aging, or
11		the administrator's designee;
12	(8)	The attorney general, or the attorney general's
13		designee;
14	(9)	The superintendent of the Hawaii department of
15		education, or the superintendent's designee; and
16	(10)	The director of commerce and consumer affairs, or the
17		director's designee.
18	(c)	At the initial meeting of the Hui Hoomana task force,
19	which sha	ll occur no later than thirty days after the effective
20	date of t	his Act, its members shall elect a chair, vice chair,
21	and any o	ther necessary officers from among its members.

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1	(d)	A majority of the voting members shall constitute a
2	quorum to	do business.
3	(e)	The Hui Hoomana task force shall meet at least
4	quarterly	but may meet as often as the members consider
5	necessary	
6	(f)	The task force shall develop:
7	(1)	A comprehensive plan, including a prioritized list of
8		actionable tasks, for the State to offer universal
9		access to high-quality healthcare and health insurance
10		at costs that are affordable for individuals,
11		employers, state and county governments, and unions;
12	(2)	A strategy and timeline for carrying out the
13		actionable tasks identified in the comprehensive plan;
14		and
15	(3)	A financial plan for securing the private, state, and
16		federal funding needed to implement the comprehensive
17		plan.
18	(g)	Members of the Hui Hoomana task force shall serve
19	without co	ompensation but may be reimbursed for reasonable
20	expenses,	including travel expenses, necessary for the
21	performanc	ce of their duties.

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(h) The Hawaii state health planning and development
 agency shall submit a preliminary report of the task force's
 findings, recommendations, and any proposed legislation to the
 legislature no later than twenty days prior to the convening of
 the regular session of 2025.

6 (i) The Hawaii state health planning and development
7 agency shall submit a final report of the task force's findings,
8 recommendations, and any proposed legislation to the legislature
9 no later than twenty days prior to the convening of the regular
10 session of 2026.

(j) The task force shall cease to exist on July 1, 2026.
SECTION 3. It is not the intent of the legislature for
this Act to jeopardize the receipt of any federal assistance or
aid. If this Act is found to be in conflict with federal
requirements that are a prescribed condition for the allocation
of federal funds to the State, this Act shall be deemed void.
SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 3000.
