A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO STATE GESTURE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the shaka gesture 2 should be recognized as the official gesture of the State. 3 While multiple origin theories exist, all theories have the shaka developing within the State. More importantly, while 4 5 multiple Hawaii ethnic cultures and resident groups have contributed varying layers of meaning to the shaka, there is a 6 shared agreement in the shaka's positive sentiments and usage 7 8 toward sharing aloha, fostering connection, and being pono.

9 The legislature further finds that the shaka is a key brand. 10 symbol for the State, offering influential power to build the 11 State's economy, global brand, and resident pride. As the shaka 12 is now used around the world, this Act ensures that Hawaii 13 retains recognition as the birthplace of the shaka. It is 14 therefore appropriate that the shaka be honored as the official 15 gesture of the State to secure recognition of Hawaii as the 16 shaka's place of origin, to preserve the meaning of the shaka as 17 originated in Hawaii, to preserve Hawaii's brand association
