## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO LOCAL AGRICULTURAL PRODUCTS.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that supporting local
- 2 agriculture and strengthening local food systems are a matter of
- 3 statewide concern that can improve the resilience of Hawaii's
- 4 economy, environment, culture, and public health. The
- 5 legislature further finds that setting clear and ambitious
- 6 target goals for the purchase of locally grown food ensures that
- 7 the State plays its role in supporting local farmers and
- 8 guarantees that revenue derived from local produce remains in
- 9 the State and feeds local people. Act 175, Session Laws of
- 10 Hawaii 2021, established a programmatic goal for the department
- 11 of education to provide a minimum of thirty per cent locally
- 12 sourced food in Hawaii public school meals by 2030. In
- 13 addition, the legislature also passed Act 176, Session Laws of
- 14 Hawaii 2021, and Act 144, Session Laws of Hawaii 2022, which
- 15 established five-year benchmarks ensuring a certain percentage
- 16 of produce that is purchased by the department of health,

- 1 department of public safety, department of defense, and
- 2 university of Hawaii system is locally grown.
- 3 The legislature also finds that the existing goals set
- 4 different standards for various state departments.
- 5 Specifically, the programmatic goal for the department of
- 6 education is to locally source at least thirty per cent of food
- 7 served in public schools by 2030, which is higher than other
- 8 state departments. The legislature believes that the goals to
- 9 provide locally-sourced food should increase at a consistent and
- 10 predictable pace across all pertinent state departments to avoid
- 11 any confusion between departments, however the legislature does
- 12 recognize that benchmark goals for certain departments should be
- 13 assessed on a more frequent basis than the department of
- 14 education.
- 15 The purpose of this Act is to resolve some of the
- 16 discrepancies between the locally sourced food benchmarks for
- 17 the department of education and those of other state entities.
- 18 SECTION 2. Section 27-8, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 19 amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows:
- "(a) The department of education, department of health,
- 21 department of corrections and rehabilitation, department of

- 2 a certain percentage of the food purchased for public schools,
- 3 youth campuses, public hospitals, public prisons, and any
- 4 purchases made directly by the University of Hawaii for use in
- 5 its academic programs, as applicable, is fresh local
- 6 agricultural products and local value-added, processed,
- 7 agricultural, or food products, as follows:
- 8 (1) By January 1, 2025, fresh local agricultural products
  9 and local value-added, processed, agricultural, or
  10 food products shall constitute a minimum of ten per
  11 cent of the total food purchased during each calendar
  12 year, as measured by the per cent of total food cost;
  13 provided that the department of education shall be
  14 exempt from the requirements of this paragraph;
  - (2) By January 1, 2030, fresh local agricultural products and local value-added, processed, agricultural, or food products shall constitute a minimum of eighteen per cent of the total food purchased during each calendar year, as measured by the per cent of total food cost; provided that the department of education shall be exempt from the requirements of this

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1		paragraph and instead shall be subject to the
2		requirements in section 302A-405.6(a)(1);
3	(3)	By January 1, 2035, fresh local agricultural products
4		and local value-added, processed, agricultural, or
5		food products shall constitute a minimum of twenty-six
6		per cent of the total food purchased during each
7		calendar year, as measured by the per cent of total
8		food cost; provided that the department of education
9		shall be exempt from the requirements of this
10		paragraph;
11	(4)	By January 1, 2040, fresh local agricultural products
12		and local value-added, processed, agricultural, or
13		food products shall constitute a minimum of thirty-
14		four per cent of the total food purchased during each
15		calendar year, as measured by the per cent of total
16		food cost;
17	(5)	By January 1, 2045, fresh local agricultural products
18		and local value-added, processed, agricultural, or
19		food products shall constitute a minimum of forty-two
20		per cent of the total food purchased during each

1		calendar year, as measured by the per cent of total		
2		food cost; and		
3	(6)	By January 1, 2050, fresh local agricultural products		
4		and local value-added, processed, agricultural, or		
5		food products shall constitute a minimum of fifty per		
6		cent of the total food purchased during each calendar		
7		year, as measured by the per cent of total food cost."		
8	SECT	ION 3. Section 302A-405.6, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is		
9	amended by amending its title and subsection (a) to read as			
10	follows:			
11	"[+]	§302A-405.6[]] Farm to school meals. (a) [By 2030,		
12	the depar	tment shall meet the local farm to school meal goal		
13	that thir	ty per cent of food served in public schools shall		
14	consist o	f locally sourced products, as measured by the

16	ensure the	at a certain percentage of the food purchased for		
17	public sc	hools and youth campuses is fresh local agricultural		
18	products	and local value-added, processed, agricultural, or food		
19	products,	as follows:		
20	(1)	By January 1, 2030, fresh local agricultural products		
21		and local value-added, processed, agricultural, or		

1		food products shall constitute a minimum of thirty per
2		cent of the total food purchased during each calendar
3		year, as measured by the per cent of total food cost;
4	(2)	By January 1, 2040, fresh local agricultural products
5		and local value-added, processed, agricultural, or
6		food products shall constitute a minimum of thirty-
7		four per cent of the total food purchased during each
8		calendar year, as measured by the per cent of total
9		<pre>food cost;</pre>
10	<u>(3)</u>	By January 1, 2045, fresh local agricultural products
11		and local value-added, processed, agricultural, or
12		food products shall constitute a minimum of forty-two
13		per cent of the total food purchased during each
14		calendar year, as measured by the per cent of total
15		food cost; and
16	(4)	By January 1, 2050, fresh local agricultural products
17		and local value-added, processed, agricultural, or
18		food products shall constitute a minimum of fifty per
19		cent of the total food purchased during each calendar
20		year, as measured by the per cent of total food cost."

#### Report Title:

Food Contracts; Local Agricultural Products; Benchmarks

#### Description:
