A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO AGRICULTURE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Chapter 141, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is

7	(1)	Create a healthy soil assessment and education

10		assistance to implement farm management practices that			
11		contribute to healthy soils;			
12	(3)	Operate the healthy soil grants program;			
13	(4)	Administer existing financial incentives to implement			
14		farm management practices that contribute to healthy			
15		soils, including the compost reimbursement program			
16		under section 141-16 and cover crop reimbursement

7	<u>(b)</u>	In ac	In administering the healthy soil assessment and				
8	education	prog	program, the department shall:				
9	(1)	Work	through technical assistance providers or				
10		eligible entities to:					
11		(A)	Encourage farmers and ranchers and land managers				
12			to undertake voluntary soil health measurements;				
13		<u>(B)</u>	Raise awareness about desirable soil health				
14			characteristics;				
15		(C)	Facilitate on-site, producer-led workshops and				
16			training sessions to promote and engender soil				
17			health stewardship; and				
18		(D)	Complete a baseline soil health assessment by				
19			testing the organic matter, water infiltration				
20			rate, microbiology, and aggregate stability of				

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1		soils, in addition to analyzing phospholipids and
2		monitoring soil cover;
3	(2)	Establish a statewide network of champions to promote
4		soil health stewardship, offer guidance to producers
5		and land managers, and encourage teamwork;
6	(3)	Create a program to provide ongoing training in soil
7		health stewardship and workshop facilitation for
8		champions and eligible entities;
9	(4)	In collaboration with technical assistance providers,
10		sponsor soil health workshops and training sessions at
11		research centers and learning sites throughout the
12		State; and
13	(5)	Educate students and the general public about the
14		importance of soil health stewardship.
15	(c)	In administering the health soil grants program, the
16	departmen	t shall:
17	(1)	Award grants to eligible entities to provide technical
18		assistance to producers and land managers in advancing
19		soil health principles and implementing supported
20		methods;

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1	(2)	Award grants as financial assistance to eligible		
2		farmers, ranchers, and other land managers who		
3		implement soil health practices on their lands;		
4	(3)	Develop a user-friendly grant program application and		
5		application and reporting processes;		
6	(4)	Develop criteria for the award of grants; provided		
7		that grants shall be awarded equitably and priority		
8		may be given to eligible entities serving young		
9		producers, veterans, small farms, or ranches or for		
10		projects that benefit economically or socially		
11		disadvantaged communities; and		
12	<u>(5)</u>	Ensure that grant funds are only used to advance soil		
13		health and soil health stewardship.		
14	(d)	The department shall encourage producer, land manager,		
15	landowner, and interagency collaboration in the management of			
16	healthy soils and shall:			
17	(1)	Work with technical assistance providers to advance		
18		soil health stewardship across federal, state, and		
19		private land jurisdictions by fostering collaboration		
20		among producers, land managers, and landowners; and		

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1	(2)	Conduct outreach to producers and land managers to				
2	promote the program and other federal, state, or local					
3	grant opportunities that support and promote healthy					
4		soils.				
5	(e)	The department shall submit a report detailing the				
6	status and progress of the healthy soils program, including the					
7	number of grants awarded, the types of soil health practices					
8	being implemented, and the benefits to soil health and					
9	agricultural productivity, and its recommendations, including					
10	any proposed legislation, to the legislature no later than					
11	twenty days prior to the convening of each regular session."					
12	SECTION 2. There is appropriated out of the general					
13	revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$500,000 or so much					
14	thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2023-2024 and the					
15	same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year					
16	2024-2025 for the establishment of the healthy soils program and					
17	to issue grants and other financial incentives pursuant to the					
18	program.					
19	The	sums appropriated shall be expended by the department				
20	cf agriculture for the purposes of this Act.
