

## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO DRIVER'S LICENSES.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that in accordance with 2 Act 159, Session Laws of Hawaii 2022, an individual who is 3 between seventy-two and seventy-nine years of age is required to renew their driver's license every four years. However, an 4 5 individual who is eighty years of age or older is required to 6 renew their driver's license every two years. The legislature 7 believes that these restrictions are unfairly restrictive for 8 individuals who are eighty years of age or older.

9 The legislature notes that many states have eliminated 10 similar age-based restrictions on driver's license renewals. 11 The legislature also recognizes that during the regular session 12 of 2022, the mayor of the city and county of Honolulu requested 13 that the legislature introduce a measure to change from two to 14 four years the period for renewal of driver's licenses for 15 individuals who are seventy-two years of age or older, without 16 any additional restrictions on those individuals who are eighty 17 years of age or older. The legislature further believes that

1 allowing individuals who are eighty years of age or older to 2 renew their respective driver's licenses every four years will 3 help to relieve any additional burdens imposed on each county's 4 respective driver licensing agency by Act 159, Session Laws of 5 Hawaii 2022, including the time and resources required to 6 process additional driver's license renewal applications.

Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to provide for the expiration, and require the renewal, of driver's licenses every four years for all individuals who are seventy-two years of age or older at time of issuance, including those individuals who are eighty years of age or older.

SECTION 2. Section 286-106, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended to read as follows:

14 "§286-106 Expiration of licenses. Every driver's license 15 issued under this part, except for a provisional license issued 16 under section 286-102.6 that shall expire on the date of the 17 provisional licensee's nineteenth birthday, whether an original issuance or a renewal, shall expire on the first birthday of the 18 19 licensee occurring no less than eight years after the date of 20 the issuance of the license, unless sooner revoked or suspended; 21 provided that:
