A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO WATER.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECT	ION 1. (a) There is established within the department
2	of busine:	ss, economic development, and tourism for
3	administr	ative purposes the desalination planning task force.
4	(b)	The task force shall comprise the following members:
5	(1)	The director of the office of planning and sustainable
6		development or the director's designee, who shall
7		serve as chairperson;
8	(2)	The director of health or the director's designee;
9	(3)	The chairperson of the commission on water resource
10		management or the chairperson's designee;
11	(4)	One member representing a municipal water agency from
12		each county, to be appointed by each respective
13		county's mayor;
14	(5)	One member from the water resources research center of
15		the university of Hawaii, to be appointed by the
16		president of the university of Hawaii;



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1	(6)	A member of the senate, to be appointed by the	
2		president of the senate;	
3	(7)	A member of the house of representatives, to be	
4		appointed by the speaker of the house of	
5		representatives; and	
6	(8)	A member of the public with relevant knowledge or	
7		experience in desalination, water resource management,	
8		or water distribution, to be appointed by the	
9		governor;	
10	provided that the task force, by a majority vote, may invite		
11	other individuals with relevant knowledge or experience to serve		
12	on the task force.		
13	(c)	The members of the task force shall not be subject to	
14	chapter 8	4, Hawaii Revised Statutes, solely based on their	
15	participa	tion on the task force.	
16	(d)	Members of the task force shall serve without	
17	compensation but shall be reimbursed for reasonable expenses,		
18	including	travel expenses, necessary for the performance of	
19	their duties.		
20	(e)	The office of planning and sustainable development	
21	shall pro	vide administrative support to the task force.	



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1	(f)	The task force shall:
2	(1)	Examine the feasibility of using desalination as a
3		source of clean and safe drinking water to supplement
4		Hawaii's existing groundwater and surface water
5		resources;
6	(2)	Determine the extent to which the use of desalination
7		will:
8		(A) Assist the State meet its projected future water
9		needs; and
10		(B) Improve the resiliency of Hawaii's water systems,
11		considering in particular the impacts of the
12		water crisis caused by contamination at the Red
13		Hill Bulk Fuel Storage Facility; and
14	(3)	Establish a plan to implement desalination, including
15		required capital improvements, projected operating
16		costs, and a projected timeline to construct and begin
17		operating desalination plants.
18	(g)	The task force shall submit a report of its findings
19	and recom	mendations, including any proposed legislation, to the
20	legislatu	re no later than twenty days prior to the convening of
21	the regul	ar session of 2024.



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1 SECTION 2. There is appropriated out of the general revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ 2 or so 3 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2023-2024 for 4 expenses of the desalination planning task force. 5 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the office of 6 planning for the purposes of this Act. 7 SECTION 3.
