A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO EDUCATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the challenges 2 associated with student engagement following the coronavirus 3 disease 2019 pandemic has highlighted the need for creative ways 4 to expand learning opportunities. Extracurricular activities 5 such as competitive sports provides students with an opportunity 6 to develop their character, experience camaraderie with 7 teammates, and learn to thrive under pressure. Accordingly, the 8 legislature recognizes the need for practical, real-life 9 implementation of statewide learning opportunities. By providing students the platform to conduct student-led 10 11 conferences, athletic activities, and support for workforce readiness initiatives and work-based learning opportunities, 12 13 students can engage in a meaningful, well-rounded education. 14 The purpose of this Act is to appropriate funds to the 15 department of education for various extracurricular programs and 16 opportunities for student success.

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1	SECTION 2. In accordance with section 9 of article VII of				
2	the Hawaii State Constitution and sections 37-91 and 37-93,				
3	Hawaii Revised Statutes, the legislature has determined that the				
4	appropriations contained in Act 164, Regular Session of 2023,				
5	and this Act will cause the state general fund expenditure				
6	ceiling for fiscal year 2024-2025 to be exceeded by				
7	\$ or per cent. This current declaration takes				
8	into account general fund appropriations authorized for fiscal				
9	year 2024-2025 in Act 164, Regular Session of 2023, and this Act				
10	only. The reasons for exceeding the general fund expenditure				
11	ceiling are that:				
12	(1) The appropriation made in this Act is necessary to				
13	serve the public interest; and				
14	(2) The appropriation made in this Act meets the needs				
15	addressed by this Act.				
16	SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general				
17	revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so much				
18	thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2024-2025, to be				
19	expended as follows:				
20	(1) \$ for the promotion and support of surfing				
21	as an interscholastic sport;
