

### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO CHILD CARE.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that a strong child care
- 2 and early education workforce is necessary to support Hawaii's
- 3 children, working families, and communities. The demand for
- 4 quality child care and early education far exceeds the number of
- 5 qualified child care and early education professionals currently
- 6 available in the State.
- 7 The legislature further finds that compensation for child
- 8 care workers is a factor regarding retention rates. According
- 9 to the Center for the Study of Child Care Employment's 2020
- 10 Early Childhood Workforce Index, the national average wage for
- 11 an early childhood worker was \$11.65 an hour and the average in
- 12 Hawaii was \$12.43 an hour. The efforts to maintain and expand
- 13 quality and affordable child care and early education programs
- 14 are hindered by the lack of qualified child care and early
- 15 education professionals.
- 16 Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to:

1	(1)	Require the department of human services to develop a
2		two-year child care worker subsidy pilot program to
3		retain existing early child care workforce in licensed
4		child care facilities for preschool children aged two
5		through five; and
6	(2)	Appropriate funds for the child care worker subsidy
7		pilot program.
8	SECT	ION 2. (a) The department of human services shall
9	establish	and implement a two-year child care worker subsidy
10	pilot pro	gram no later than six months after the effective date
11	of this Ad	ct.
12	(b)	The department of human services shall develop
13	standards	and qualifications for participation in the pilot
14	program by	y child care workers, which shall at a minimum meet the
15	following	requirements:
16	(1)	The pilot program shall be available to all lead
17		caregivers, caregivers, and child care aides in child
18		care facilities for preschool children, aged two
19		through five, licensed by the department of human
20		services;

1	(2)	Participants shall not be employed by the department	
2		of education, public charter schools, or federally	
3		funded early head start program; and	
4	(3)	Participants shall be limited to child care workers	
5		working in licensed child care facilities for	
6		preschool children, aged two through five, only.	
7	(c)	The department of human services shall utilize the	
8	child car	e grant program special fund to subsidize participant's	
9	wages to	ensure that all participants are paid wages of at least	
10	\$19.00 per hour.		
11	(d)	The department may convene and consult community	
12	members t	o establish best practices, policies, or procedures,	
13	including	the development of a salary schedule, educational	
14	requirements, and other matters that would assist implementation		
15	of the program.		
16	(e)	The department of human services shall submit annual	
17	reports o	n the pilot program development and implementation,	
18	including	impacts to child care facility operators, staff, and	
19	any propo	sed legislation, to the legislature no later than	

twenty days prior to the convening of the regular sessions of

2024 and 2025.

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- 1 (f) The department of human services shall submit a final
- 2 report on the pilot program, including impacts to child care
- 3 facility operators, staff, and any proposed legislation, to the
- 4 legislature no later than twenty days prior to the convening of
- 5 the regular session of 2026.
- 6 (g) The pilot program shall cease to exist on June 30,
- 7 2026.
- 8 SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general
- 9 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so
- 10 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2023-2024 and
- 11 the same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal
- 12 year 2024-2025 to be deposited into the child care grant program
- 13 special fund.
- 14 SECTION 4. There is appropriated out of the child care
- 15 grant program special fund the sum of \$ or so much
- 16 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2023-2024 and the
- 17 same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year
- 18 2024-2025 to be used for the child care worker subsidy pilot
- 19 program established by section 2 of this Act.
- The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department
- 21 of human services for the purposes of this Act.

1 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2023.
