

A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO HEALTH.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that although the State
- 2 has taken many important steps to make medical cannabis
- 3 available, further action is needed to ensure access. One way
- 4 to improve access is to expand the scope for professionals who
- 5 may provide written certification for qualifying patients to use
- 6 medical cannabis. The legislature further finds that, as
- 7 determined by the state board of naturopathic medicine, it is
- 8 within the scope of naturopathic practice to manage patient's
- 9 medical cannabis use. Naturopathic physicians are considered
- 10 primary care providers in Hawaii, and there are many patients in
- 11 the State whose primary care provider is a naturopathic
- 12 physician.
- 13 Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to improve patient
- 14 access to medical cannabis by authorizing naturopathic
- 15 physicians to provide written certifications to qualifying
- 16 patients for the medical use of cannabis.

SECTION 2. Section 329-121, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 2 amended as follows: 3 1. By adding four new definitions to be appropriately 4 inserted and to read: 5 ""Distant site" means the location of the physician, 6 naturopathic physician, or advanced practice registered nurse 7 delivering services through telehealth at the time the services 8 are provided. 9 "Naturopathic physician" means a person who holds a current 10 license to practice naturopathic medicine under chapter 455. 11 "Originating site" means the location where the patient is 12 located, whether accompanied or not by a health care provider, 13 at the time services are provided by a physician, naturopathic 14 physician, or advanced practice registered nurse through 15 telehealth, including but not limited to a physician's, 16 naturopathic physician's, nurse's, or other health care 17 provider's office, hospital, health care facility, a patient's 18 home, and other non-medical environments such as school-based 19 health centers, university-based health centers, or the work 20 location of a patient.

- 1 "Telehealth" means the use of telecommunications, as that
- 2 term is defined in section 269-1, to encompass four modalities:
- 3 store and forward technologies, remote monitoring, live
- 4 consultation, and mobile health; and which shall include but not
- 5 be limited to real-time video conferencing-based communication,
- 6 and secure asynchronous information exchange, to transmit
- 7 patient medical information, including diagnostic-quality
- 8 digital images and laboratory results for medical interpretation
- 9 and diagnosis, for the purposes of delivering enhanced health
- 10 care services and information, as appropriate to the
- 11 practitioner's scope of practice described in chapter 453, 455,
- 12 or 457, while a patient is at an originating site and the
- 13 physician, naturopathic physician, or advanced practice
- 14 registered nurse is at a distant site; establishing a physician-
- 15 patient, naturopathic physician-patient, or advanced practice
- 16 registered nurse-patient relationship; evaluating a patient; or
- 17 treating a patient."
- 18 2. By amending the definition of "advanced practice
- 19 registered nurse" to read:
- ""Advanced practice registered nurse" means [an] a person
- 21 who holds a current license to practice nursing as an advanced

8		caregiver" to read:

10	current l	icense to practice <u>medicine</u> under chapter 453 [and is
11	licensed	with authority to prescribe drugs and is registered
12	under sec	tion 329-32]. "Physician" does not include a physician
13	assistant	as described in section 453-5.3.
14	"Pri	mary caregiver" means a person eighteen years of age or
15	older, ot	her than the qualifying patient and the qualifying
16	patient's	physician, naturopathic physician, or advanced
17	practice	registered nurse, who has agreed to undertake
18	responsib	ility for managing the well-being of the qualifying
19	patient w	rith respect to the medical use of cannabis. In the
20	case of a	minor or an adult lacking legal capacity, the primary

- 2 custody."
- 3 5. By amending the definition of "qualifying patient" to
- 4 read:
- 5 ""Qualifying patient" means a person who has been diagnosed
- 6 by a physician, naturopathic physician, or advanced practice
- 7 registered nurse as having a debilitating medical condition."
- **8** 6. By amending the definition of "written certification"
- 9 to read:
- ""Written certification" means the qualifying patient's
- 11 medical records or a statement signed by a qualifying patient's
- 12 physician, naturopathic physician, or advanced practice
- 13 registered nurse, stating that in the physician's, naturopathic
- 14 physician's, or advanced practice registered nurse's
- 15 professional opinion, the qualifying patient has a debilitating
- 16 medical condition and the potential benefits of the medical use
- 17 of cannabis would likely outweigh the health risks for the
- 18 qualifying patient. The department of health may require,
- 19 through its rulemaking authority, that all written
- 20 certifications comply with a designated form. "Written
- 21 certifications" are valid for one year from the time of signing;

1	provided t	that the department of health may allow for the
2	validity o	of any written certification for up to three years if

6	SECT	ION 3. Section 329-122, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
7	amended by	y amending subsections (a) and (b) to read as follows:
8	"(a)	Notwithstanding any law to the contrary, the medical
9	use of car	nnabis by a qualifying patient shall be permitted only
10	if:	
11	(1)	The qualifying patient has been diagnosed by a
12		physician, naturopathic physician, or advanced
13		practice registered nurse as having a debilitating
14		medical condition;
15	(2)	The qualifying patient's physician, naturopathic
16		physician, or advanced practice registered nurse has
17		obtained a registration issued by the department of
18		<pre>public safety under section 329-32;</pre>
19	[-(2) -]	(3) The qualifying patient's physician, naturopathic
20		<pre>physician, or advanced practice registered nurse has</pre>
21		certified in writing that, in the physician's,

1		<pre>naturopathic physician's, or advanced practice</pre>
2		registered nurse's professional opinion, the potential
3		benefits of the medical use of cannabis would likely
4		outweigh the health risks for the particular

12		explained the potential risks and benefits of the
13		medical use of cannabis to the qualifying patient and
14		to a parent, guardian, or person having legal custody
15		of the qualifying patient; and
16	(2)	A parent, guardian, or person having legal custody
17		consents in writing to:
18		(A) Allow the qualifying patient's medical use of
19		cannabis;
20		(B) Serve as the qualifying patient's primary
21		caregiver; and

1	(C) Control the acquisition of the cannabis, the
2	dosage, and the frequency of the medical use of
3	cannabis by the qualifying patient."
4	SECTION 4. Section 329-123, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
5	amended by amending subsections (a) and (b) to read as follows:
6	"(a) Physicians, naturopathic physicians, or advanced
7	practice registered nurses who issue written certifications
8	shall provide, in each written certification, the name, address,
9	patient identification number, and other identifying information
10	of the qualifying patient. The department of health shall
11	require, in rules adopted pursuant to chapter 91, that all
12	written certifications comply with a designated form completed
13	by or on behalf of a qualifying patient. The form shall require
14	information from the applicant, primary caregiver, and
15	physician, naturopathic physician, or advanced practice
16	registered nurse as specifically required or permitted by this
17	chapter. The form shall require the address of the location
18	where the cannabis is grown and shall appear on the registry
19	card issued by the department of health. The certifying
20	physician, naturopathic physician, or advanced practice
21	registered nurse shall be required to have a bona fide

- 1 physician-patient relationship, bona fide naturopathic
- 2 physician-patient relationship, or bona fide advanced practice
- 3 registered nurse-patient relationship, as applicable, with the
- 4 qualifying patient. All current active medical cannabis permits
- 5 shall be honored through their expiration date.
- **6** (b) Qualifying patients shall register with the department
- 7 of health. The registration shall be effective until the
- 8 expiration of the certificate issued by the department of health
- 9 and signed by the physician, naturopathic physician, or advanced
- 10 practice registered nurse. Every qualifying patient shall
- 11 provide sufficient identifying information to establish the
- 12 personal identities of the qualifying patient and the primary
- 13 caregiver. Qualifying patients shall report changes in
- 14 information within ten working days. Every qualifying patient
- 15 shall have only one primary caregiver at any given time. The
- 16 department of health shall issue to the qualifying patient a
- 17 registration certificate and may charge a fee for the
- 18 certificate in an amount adopted by rules pursuant to chapter
- **19** 91."
- 20 SECTION 5. Section 329-126, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 21 amended to read as follows:

19	SECT	ION 6. Section 329-128, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is				
20	amended b	y amending subsection (b) to read as follows:				

1 "	(b)	Notwithstanding	anv	law	to ti	he o	contrary.	fraudulen

- 2 misrepresentation to a law enforcement official of any fact or
- 3 circumstance relating to the issuance of a written certificate
- 4 by a physician, naturopathic physician, or advanced practice
- 5 registered nurse not covered under section 329-126 for the
- 6 medical use of cannabis shall be a misdemeanor. This penalty
- 7 shall be in addition to any other penalties that may apply for
- 8 the non-medical use of cannabis."
- 9 SECTION 7. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
- 10 matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
- 11 begun before its effective date.
- 12 SECTION 8. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 13 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 14 SECTION 9. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2023.

Report Title:

Naturopathic Physicians; Medical Use of Cannabis; Authorization; Telehealth

Description:

Authorizes naturopathic physicians to provide written certification to qualifying patients for the medical use of cannabis. Clarifies provisions regarding the establishment of bona fide physician-patient, naturopathic physician-patient, and advanced practice registered nurse-patient relationships via telehealth.
