# A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE FUEL TANK ADVISORY COMMITTEE.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. Section 342L-62, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 2 amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows: 3 "(a) The advisory committee shall hold no fewer than one 4 regular meeting in each quarter of a calendar year. The 5 advisory committee shall study issues related to leaks of field-constructed underground fuel storage tanks at the Red Hill 6 7 Bulk Fuel Storage Facility, Kuahua Peninsula, Pacific Missile 8 Range Facility Barking Sands, Hickam Pol Annex, and Schofield 9 Barracks Military Reservation. The advisory committee shall 10 consider:

11 (1) The short- and long-term effects of leaks of the fuel 12 tanks, including effects relating to the health of 13 residents, safe drinking water, and the environment; 14 (2) Response strategies to mitigate the effects of leaks 15 from fuel tanks;

16 (3) Methods to improve communication between the United
17 States Navy, Air Force, and Army; the State; any local

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1		board of water supply; and the public in the event of	
2		a leak of any fuel tank;	
3	(4)	Groundwater test results in relation to the	
4		surrounding areas of fuel tank facilities, with a	
5		particular emphasis on the groundwater near the Red	
6		Hill Bulk Fuel Storage Facility;	
7	(5)	The implications of shutting down any fuel tank	
8		facility; and	
9	(6)	Updates on progress toward meeting goals of agreement	
10		between the State, the affected county, and the	
11		federal government."	
12	SECT	ION 2. There is appropriated out of the general	
13	revenues	of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so	
14	much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2023-2024 and		
15	the same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal		
16	year 2024-2025 to obtain contractor support for additional		
17	meetings of the fuel tank advisory committee.		
18	The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department		
19	of health	for the purposes of this Act.	



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SECTION 3. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
 matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
 begun before its effective date.
 SECTION 4. New statutory material is underscored.
 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2050.
