A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO DECEPTIVE TRADE PRACTICES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. The legislature finds that Hawaii residents are
 often barred from claiming offers for free or reduced rate
 shipping, which are more commonly available to purchasers in
 other states. Many retailers also apply an arbitrary shipping
 cost to Hawaii residents, which does not correlate with the
 actual cost of shipping.

7 The purpose of this Act is to establish that charging 8 shipping and delivery charges that exceed the actual cost 9 charged to the seller to ship or deliver a commodity to a 10 consumer in the State shall constitute an unfair and deceptive 11 practice.

SECTION 2. Chapter 481B, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated and to read as follows:

15 "<u>§481B-</u> Shipping charges. In the sale or purchase of
16 any commodity to be shipped or delivered to a consumer in the
17 State, if a seller imposes a separate charge for shipping or

delivery to a consumer, that charge shall not exceed the actual
 cost charged to the seller to ship or deliver the commodity to a
 consumer in the State."
