A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO BOOSTER CLUBS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that although school
- 2 booster clubs are independent entities separate from the
- 3 department of education, school booster clubs are publicly
- 4 perceived as being overseen by the department and the specific
- 5 schools to which they are connected and benefit financially from
- 6 those affiliations.
- 7 The purpose of this Act is to require school booster clubs
- 8 to be audited on a regular basis to avoid the misuse of funds
- 9 intended for public schools and ensure compliance with federal
- 10 and state laws.
- 11 SECTION 2. Chapter 28, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended
- 12 by adding a new section to be appropriately designated and to
- 13 read as follows:
- 14 "\$28- School booster clubs; audit. Notwithstanding any
- 15 other law, board of education policy, or board of education
- 16 standard of practice to the contrary and notwithstanding any
- 17 determination that school booster clubs are independent entities



- 1 separate from the department of education, school booster clubs
- 2 that raise more than \$50,000 shall be audited by the department
- 3 of the attorney general's tax and charities division on a
- 4 regular basis. An audited school booster club shall reimburse
- 5 the department of the attorney general for the costs incurred in
- 6 auditing the school booster club."
- 7 SECTION 3. New statutory material is underscored.
- 8 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on June 30, 3000.

Requires school booster clubs who raise more than \$50,000 to be audited by the department of attorney general's tax and charities division on a regular basis. Requires the audited school booster club to reimburse the costs of the audit. Effective 6/30/3000. (HD1)
