A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION:

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that perfluoroalkyl and
- 2 polyfluoroalkyl substances (PFAS) are persistent, toxic
- 3 substances that can contaminate drinking water, bioaccumulate in
- 4 fish and wildlife, and have multiple adverse health effects on
- 5 humans. PFAS are utilized in a broad range of products,
- 6 including clothing, textiles, food packaging, and cosmetic
- 7 products such as lotions, nail polish, shaving cream, and
- 8 mascara.
- 9 The legislature further finds that PFAS are often called
- 10 "forever chemicals" due to the fact that they do not naturally
- 11 break down in the environment and can continue to pollute the
- 12 environment for thousands of years. PFAS can enter the human
- 13 body when consumed, applied directly on skin, and after eating
- 14 food packaged in materials that contain PFAS. In 2022, the
- 15 legislature passed Act 152, Session Laws of Hawaii 2022, which
- 16 prohibits, by the end of 2024, PFAS in certain types of food
- 17 packaging and firefighting foam. However, in light of the



- 1 recent spill of approximately one thousand three hundred gallons
- 2 of toxic PFAS-containing firefighting foam at Red Hill in
- 3 November 2022 and the discovery of another firefighting foam
- 4 spill in September 2020, it is evident that further action is
- 5 needed.
- 6 As an island state, when these forever chemicals are
- 7 brought in the State, they never leave. Instead, they make
- 8 their way into residents' bodies and the State's wastewater,
- 9 landfills, and eventually groundwater and the drinking water
- 10 supply. Hawaii can no longer afford to import toxic substances
- 11 that contaminate the State's finite resources and risk
- 12 residents' health.
- Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to prohibit the
- 14 manufacture, sale, offer for sale, distribution for sale, and
- 15 distribution for use of any food packaging, food service ware,
- 16 cosmetic, or personal care product that contains PFAS, with
- 17 certain exceptions.
- 18 SECTION 2. Chapter 321, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 19 amended by adding a new section to part XLVII to be
- 20 appropriately designated and to read as follows:

13		Drug Administration under the Federal Food, Drug, and
14		Cosmetic Act (21 U.S.C. 321 et seq.); section 3.2(e)
15		of title 21 Code of Federal Regulations; or the
16		Dietary Supplement Health and Education Act of 1994.
17	(b)	For the purposes of this section:
18	<u>"Cc</u>	osmetic" has the same meaning as in section 321-30.4.
19	<u>"Fo</u>	ood packaging" has the same meaning as in section 321-
20	601.	

"Perfluoroalkyl and polyfluoroalkyl substances" has the 1 2 same meaning as in section 321-601. "Personal care product" has the same meaning as in section 3 4 321-30.5." 5 SECTION 3. Section 321-602, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 6 repealed. 7 ["[\$321-602] Food packaging; prohibited items. (a) Beginning December 31, 2024, it shall be unlawful to 8 9 manufacture, sell, offer for sale, distribute for sale, or 10 distribute for use in the State any food packaging specified in subsection (b) to which PFAS chemicals have been intentionally 11 12 introduced in any amount. 13 (b) The prohibition under this section shall apply to 14 wraps and liners, plates, food boats, and pizza boxes."] 15 SECTION 4. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed 16 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored. 17 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect on June 30, 3000.

Description:

Beginning 12/31/2026, prohibits the manufacture, sale, offer for sale, distribution for sale, and distribution for use of any food packaging, food service ware, cosmetic, or personal care product that contains perfluoroalkyl and polyfluoroalkyl substances, with certain exceptions. Effective 6/30/3000. (HD1)
