A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO EDUCATION.

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BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. The legislature finds that it is important to

continue to support the incorporation of trauma-informed

ducation in the State's public education system. Trauma
informed education involves mental health education for

5 students, teachers, staff, parents, and community members; adds

6 a flexible, responsive, and measured strategy for addressing

7 trauma; and is an important component to the department of

 $oldsymbol{8}$ education's multi-tier system of supports.

In 2021, the legislature established a trauma-informed education program in the windward district, which built upon the work of Compassionate Koʻolaupoko. Compassionate Koʻolaupoko has brought together schools, community groups, businesses, and community members to envision what a trauma-informed community would look like. The legislature also appropriated funds for two positions to expand trauma-informed education and care in the Koʻolaupoko region. Over the past year, there have been numerous students, faculty, and community members who have been

- 1 positively impacted by this trauma-informed education program.
- 2 Through the trauma-informed education program, educators and
- 3 other school faculty have received training on trauma awareness
- 4 and have learned skills to recognize behavior that results from
- 5 exposure to trauma. Consequently, students and families have
- 6 been able to engage in culturally informed, place-based
- 7 restorative practices.
- 8 The purpose of this Act is to establish and appropriate
- 9 funds for permanent positions to continue the trauma-informed
- 10 education program in the Castle-Kahuku and Kailua-Kalaheo
- 11 complex areas.
- 12 SECTION 2. There is appropriated out of the general
- 13 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$111,606 or so much
- 14 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2023-2024 and the
- 15 same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year
- 16 2024-2025 for one full-time equivalent (1.0 FTE) permanent
- 17 complex area compassionate Koʻolaupoko trauma-informed resource
- 18 teacher position; provided that the position shall:
- 19 (1) Design and deliver high quality professional learning
- 20 opportunities and technical assistance, including
- 21 culturally-relevant, best practices in trauma-

1		responsive practices to build capacity and
2		sustainability;
3	(2)	Collaborate with district and school-level staff and
4		partnering organizations to access and coordinate
5		appropriate resources;
6	(3)	Support meetings with the district education
7		specialist to advance projects and programs; provide
8		technical assistance on designated priorities; and
9		collaborate with internal staff and external groups,
10		state and federal agencies, and business or
11		professional associations;
12	(4)	Assist the district education specialist with
13		coordination and collection of programmatic
14		information for testimony, reports, and presentations
15		to various audiences, including but not limited to the
16		legislature and board of education;
17	(5)	Adhere to all procurement rules, regulations, and
18		contractual requirements of the department of
19		education and state and federal entities;
20	(6)	Assist the district education specialist in hosting
21		advisory council meetings as needed in order to

1	provide culturally attuned, trauma-responsive
2	information that is helpful to the community; and
3	(7) Perform other related duties as required or assigned.
4	The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department
5	of education for the purposes of this Act.
6	SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general
7	revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$140,073 or so much
8	thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2023-2024 and the
9	same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year
10	2024-2025 for one full-time equivalent (1.0 FTE) permanent
11	district educational specialist II position, to be located
12	within the office of the Castle-Kahuku complex area
13	superintendent; provided that the position shall include:
14	(1) Design and deliver high quality professional learning
15	opportunities and technical assistance, including
16	culturally-relevant, evidence-based best practices in
17	trauma-informed practices to build capacity and
18	sustainability;
19	(2) Collaborate with district and school-level staff and
20	partnering organizations to access and coordinate
21	appropriate resources;

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1	(3)	Provide leadership and administrative oversight for
2		the compassionate Koʻolaupoko coalition, including the
3		development and delivery of activities that ensure
4		that the goals and objectives of the designated funds
5		are achieved and engaging stakeholders;
6	(4)	Support monthly meetings with the steering committee
7		to advance projects and programs; provide technical
8		assistance on designated priorities; and collaborate
9		with internal staff and external groups, state and
10		federal agencies, and business or professional
11		associations;
12	(5)	Execute fiscal, personnel, and contract transactions
13		in a timely manner; oversee project budgets and
14		ensures full, proper, and compliant utilization of
15		resources; and gather and analyzes all interim, annual
16		progress, and expenditure reports to ensure compliance
17		with appropriate laws, policies, procedures, and grant
18		terms and conditions;
19	(6)	Coordinate the collection of and provides
20		administrative, fiscal, and programmatic information

for testimony, reports, and presentations to various

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1		audiences, including but not limited to the
2		legislature and board of education;
3	(7)	Adhere to all procurement rules, regulations, and
4		contractual requirements of the department of
5		education and state and federal entities;
6	(8)	Help to host advisory council meetings three times a
7		year to promote quality assurance in execution of
8		implementation plans; and
9	(9)	Perform other related duties as required or assigned
10	The	sums appropriated shall be expended by the department
11	of educat	ion for the purposes of this Act.
12	SECT	TON 4. This Act shall take effect on June 30, 3000.
