A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO EMERGENCY MEDICAL RESPONSE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that in critical medical
- 2 emergencies, each minute matters. Long-term injury, brain
- 3 damage, and even death can occur within just a few minutes in
- 4 some types of emergencies. Whether it is a student choking or a
- 5 teacher experiencing cardiac arrest, help provided within four
- 6 minutes, rather than eight minutes, can save a life.
- 7 The legislature further finds that while the department of
- 8 education currently has basic emergency response guidance, there
- 9 is a gap between the guidance provided to "administer first aid"
- 10 and the training and preparedness of personnel in the case of an
- 11 unforeseen critical medical emergency.
- Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to supplement the
- 13 department of education's emergency procedures guide,
- 14 RS 10-0431, by requiring that each public school's
- 15 administration and public charter school's administration
- 16 appoint any member of the staff to be a critical emergency
- 17 response team member.

| 8 | response team that shall consist of critical emergency response |
| 9 | team members. |
| 10 | (b) Each critical emergency response team member shall: |
| 11 | (1) Maintain active certifications in first aid, |
| 12 | cardiopulmonary resuscitation, and automated external |
| 13 | defibrillator from organizations approved by the |
| 14 | department; provided that any certification more than |
| 15 | two years old shall not be valid for purposes of this |

| 7 | revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so |
| 8 | much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2023-2024 and |
| 9 | the same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal |
| 10 | year 2024-2025 for public schools to implement critical medical |
| 11 | emergency teams. |
| 12 | The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department |
| 13 | of education for the purposes of this Act. |
| 14 | SECTION 5. There is appropriated out of the general |
| 15 | revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so |
| 16 | much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2023-2024 and |
| 17 | the same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal |
| 18 | year 2024-2025 for public charter schools to implement critical |
| 19 | medical emergency teams. |
| 20 | The sums appropriated shall be expended by the state public |
| 21 | charter school commission for the purposes of this Act. |

- 2 SECTION 7. This Act shall take effect on June 30, 3000.
