## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO PARTIAL PUBLIC FINANCING OF ELECTIONS.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that it has been two decades since the amount of funds available to candidates in 2 3 Hawaii's partial public financing program were last amended. 4 The purpose of this Act is to increase: 5 (1) The amount of funds available to candidates who qualify to participate in the partial public financing 6 7 program, including candidates for the board of 8 trustees of the office of Hawaiian affairs, who run 9 state-wide; 10 (2)The minimum amount of qualifying contributions certain 11 candidates must receive to participate in the program; 12 and Matching fund payments from \$1 for each \$1 of 13 (3) 14 qualifying contributions in excess of the minimum 15 qualifying contribution amounts to \$2 for each \$1 of 16 excess qualifying contributions.

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SECTION 2. Section 11-425, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 1 2 amended to read as follows: "§11-425 Maximum amount of public funds available to 3 4 candidate. (a) The maximum amount of public funds available in 5 each election to a candidate for [the]: 6 (1) The office of governor, lieutenant governor, or mayor 7 of the city and county of Honolulu or county of Hawaii 8 shall not exceed [ten] fifteen per cent [of the 9 expenditure limit established in section 11-423(d) for 10 each election. 11 (b) The maximum amount of public funds available in each 12 election to a candidate for the]; The office of state senator, state representative, 13 (2) 14 mayor of the county of Kauai or county of Maui, county 15 council member, and prosecuting attorney shall not 16 exceed [fifteen] 22.5 per cent [of the expenditure 17 limit established in section-11-423(d) for each 18 election. 19 (c) For the]; or

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(3) The office of Hawaiian affairs [, the maximum amount of 1 public-funds available-to a candidate] shall not 2 3 exceed [\$1,500 in any election year.] ten per cent, 4 of the expenditure limit established in section 11-423(d) for 5 each election. 6 (d) For all other offices, the maximum amount of public 7 funds available to a candidate shall not exceed \$100 in any 8 election year. 9 (e) [(b) Each candidate who qualified for the maximum 10 amount of public funding in any primary election and who is a 11 candidate for a subsequent general election shall apply with the 12 commission to be qualified to receive the maximum amount of 13 public funds as provided in this section for the respective 14 general election. 15 (c) For purposes of this section, "qualified" means 16 meeting the qualifying campaign contribution requirements of 17 section 11-429." 18 SECTION 3. Section 11-429, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 19 amended by amending subsections (a) and (b) to read as follows: 20 "(a) As a condition of receiving public funds for a 21 primary or general election, a candidate shall not be unopposed

6		the aggregate exceed [ <del>\$5,000;</del> ] <u>\$3,000;</u>
7	(5)	For the office of county councilfor each respective
8		county:
9		(A) County of Honoluluqualifying contributions that
10		in the aggregate exceed \$5,000;
11		(B) County of Hawaiiqualifying contributions that
12		in the aggregate exceed \$1,500;
13		(C) County of Mauiqualifying contributions that in
14		the aggregate exceed [ <del>\$5,000;</del> ] <u>\$4,000;</u> and
15		(D) County of Kauaiqualifying contributions that in
16		the aggregate exceed \$3,000;
17	(6)	For the office of state senatorqualifying
18		contributions that $[\tau]$ in the aggregate exceed \$2,500;
19	(7)	For the office of state representativequalifying
20		contributions that[ $_{ au}$ ] in the aggregate[ $_{ au}$ ] exceed
21		\$1,500;

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1 (8) For the office of Hawaiian affairs--qualifying 2 contributions that  $[\tau]$  in the aggregate  $[\tau]$  exceed [<del>\$1,500;</del>] \$5,000; and 3 4 (9) For all other offices, qualifying contributions that, in the aggregate, exceed \$500. 5 (b) A candidate shall obtain the minimum qualifying 6 contribution amount set forth in subsection (a) once for the 7 8 election period. 9 [(1)] If the candidate obtains the minimum qualifying 10 contribution amount, the candidate [is] shall be eligible to 11 receive: [<del>(A)</del>] (1) The minimum payment in an amount equal to the 12 13 minimum qualifying contribution amounts; and 14 (2) Payments of [\$1] \$2 for each \$1 of qualifying [<del>-(B)-</del>] 15 contributions in excess of the minimum qualifying 16 contribution amounts [; and 17 (2)]. 18 A candidate shall have at least one other qualified 19 candidate as an opponent for the primary or general election to 20 receive public funds for that election."

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1	SECTION 4. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
2	matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
3	begun before its effective date.
4	SECTION 5. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
5	and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
6	SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2023.
