HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF LAND AND NATURAL RESOURCES TO CONVENE A MAKUA VALLEY TASK FORCE TO PREPARE FOR THE TRANSITION OF THE MANAGEMENT OF THE MAKUA MILITARY RESERVATION FROM THE UNITED STATES ARMY TO THE STATE.

WHEREAS, Makua Valley on Oahu was seized by the United 1 2 States military for training following the attack on Pearl Harbor on December 7, 1941; and 3 4 5 WHEREAS, Hawaiian, Japanese, and Portuguese families living in Makua Valley were evicted from their lands, with the promise 6 that the displacement would be temporary and their lands would 7 be cleaned up and returned; and 8 9 10 WHEREAS, instead, Makua Valley remained under the management of the United States Army and continued to be the 11 site of decades of live-fire military training; and 12 13 WHEREAS, the Makua Military Reservation spans nearly five 14 thousand acres and is home to over forty endangered and 15 threatened species and dozens of sacred and cultural sites; and 16 17 18 WHEREAS, in December 2023, the United States Department of Defense confirmed that it would permanently end live-fire 19 training in Makua Valley; and 20 21 22 WHEREAS, under the terms of a 2001 settlement, the military 23 has not conducted live-fire training at Makua Valley since 2004; however, the court filing removed the threat that Makua would 24 25 ever again be subjected to live-fire training; and 26 27 WHEREAS, management of the Makua Military Reservation will transfer from the United States Army to the State when General 28 29 Lease No. S-3848 expires in 2029; and



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1 2 WHEREAS, the creation of a task force would facilitate conversations necessary to prepare for the transition of the 3 management of the Makua Military Reservation from the United 4 States Army to the State; now, therefore, 5 6 7 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the Thirty-second Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular 8 Session of 2024, the Senate concurring, that the Department of 9 Land and Natural Resources is requested to convene a Makua 10 11 Valley Task Force to prepare for the transition of the management of the Makua Military Reservation from the United 12 States Army to the State; and 13 14 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Makua Valley Task Force is 15 16 requested to consist of the following members: 17 18 (1)The Chairperson of the Board of Land and Natural Resources, or the Chairperson's designee; 19 20 (2) A member of the Board of Trustees of the Office of 21 Hawaiian Affairs, or the member's designee; 22 23 24 (3) A member of the House of Representatives, to be selected by the Speaker of the House of 25 Representatives; 26 27 (4) A member of the Senate, to be selected by the 28 President of the Senate; and 29 30 31 (5) A member of the Aha Moku Advisory Committee; and 32 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the task force is requested to 33 invite representatives of the following organizations to serve 34 35 on the task force: 36 37 (1)One representative of families who were evicted from 38 Makua Valley or whose lands in Makua Valley were 39 condemned by the federal government; 40



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Three representatives, each representing a different 1 (2)non-profit organization, with expertise on Makua 2 3 Valley; and 4 5 (3) A representative selected from a list provided by native Hawaiian organizations; and 6 7 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the task force is requested to 8 invite the Commanding General of the United States Army Pacific, 9 or the Commanding General's designee, to serve as a military 10 11 representative on the task force; and 12 13 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the task force is requested to elect a chairperson from among themselves; and 14 15 16 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that in preparing for the transition of the management of the Makua Military Reservation from the 17 United States Army, the task force is requested to enter into 18 19 discussions with the United States Army to: 20 (1)Facilitate the expedient return of the Makua Military 21 Reservation upon the expiration of the United States 22 Army's lease; 23 24 Ensure the clean-up of unexploded ordnance; and 25 (2) 26 Ensure the expansion of opportunities for cultural 27 (3) 28 access; and 29 30 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the task force is requested to base its plans and policies for transition on the goal of 31 transferring the lands currently held by the United States Army 32 under General Lease No. S-3848 to the State, which shall: 33 34 35 (1)Hold the lands in trust as part of the public land 36 trust; and 37 Transfer management and control of the lands to the 38 (2) sovereign native Hawaiian entity upon its recognition 39 40 by the United States and the State; and 41



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BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that members of the task force shall 1 serve without compensation, but shall be reimbursed for 2 reasonable expenses necessary for the performance of their 3 duties, including travel expenses; and 4 5 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the task force is requested to 6 submit a report of its findings and recommendations, including 7

any proposed legislation, to the Legislature no later than 8 twenty days prior to the convening of the Regular Session of 9 2025; and 10

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the task force shall cease to 12 exist six months after the August 16, 2029, expiration of the 13 United States Army's lease for the Makua Military Reservation 14 under General Lease No. S-3848; and 15

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 17 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Commanding Officer 18 of the United States Army Pacific, Chairperson of the Board of 19 20 Land and Natural Resources, and Executive Director of the Aha Moku Advisory Committee. 21
