H.C.R. NO. 178

HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE LEGISLATIVE REFERENCE BUREAU TO STUDY THE IMPLEMENTATION OF A YEAR-ROUND LEGISLATURE.

1 WHEREAS, the constitutionally mandated length of a 2 legislative session is sixty working days per year, generally 3 stretching from the third Wednesday in January until early May; 4 and 5 WHEREAS, certain facets of community engagement, emergency 6 7 response, and other operational aspects of the Legislature could 8 be improved by requiring the Legislature to be in session throughout the whole year; and 9 10 11 WHEREAS, a year-round Legislature in Hawaii could provide a more thorough understanding of public sentiment, as lawmakers 12 13 have increased opportunities to interact with their constituents and stakeholders and analyze community needs in greater detail, 14 which enables them to have a more precise understanding of 15 16 public opinion on a wide range of social and economic issues; 17 and 18 19 WHEREAS, legislatures in the nation with longer legislative sessions are more likely to establish policies that address 20 specific concerns of their state, rather than applying policies 21 from other states and national lobbying organizations; and 22 23 24 WHEREAS, a year-round Legislature would also increase 25 transparency as it would provide lawmakers more time to address statewide issues while also providing more opportunity for 26 public input and engagement; and 27 28 29 WHEREAS, however, a year-long Legislature would require 30 increased staffing and resources; and 31



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1 WHEREAS, the costs associated with a year-long Legislature 2 have not been studied in depth and there is no understanding of 3 the potential financial burden on taxpayers if the Legislature 4 were to operate year-round; now, therefore, 5

6 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the Thirty-second Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular 7 Session of 2024, the Senate concurring, that the Legislative 8 9 Reference Bureau is requested to study the implementation of a 10 year-round Legislature, including the effects of a year-round Legislature on staff retention, salary and economic support 11 costs, program costs, and financial ramifications of other forms 12 13 of employment held by legislators; and 14

15 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Legislative Reference 16 Bureau is requested to submit a report of its study, including 17 findings, recommendations, and any proposed legislation, to the 18 Legislature no later than twenty days prior to the convening of 19 the Regular Session of 2025; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a certified copy of this
Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Director of the
Legislative Reference Bureau.
