HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE DIRECTOR OF HEALTH TO CONVENE A WORKING GROUP TO ADDRESS ISSUES RELATING TO PATIENT TRANSFER AND AMBULANCE SERVICES AND EVALUATE POTENTIAL SOLUTIONS.

WHEREAS, patients on Oahu and in the neighbor islands are 1 2 currently experiencing significant delays while waiting for transfer to a higher level of care; and 3 4 WHEREAS, according to the Hawaii Chapter of the American 5 College of Emergency Physicians (HACEP), these delays have led 6 to serious, sometimes even fatal repercussions for affected 7 patients; and 8 9 WHEREAS, HACEP has conducted a preliminary review of these 10 11 cases which affirms the critical need to address this issue and has identified three primary issues with the current patient 12 transfer and ambulance system; and 13 14 WHEREAS, first, unless there is a preexisting agreement 15 between two hospitals, if a physician caring for a patient needs 16 specific services not available at the physician's healthcare 17 facility, the physician must research what is available at other 18 facilities and contact them one by one to determine whether the 19 other facility has the services and bed space to care for the 20 patient; this can lead to significant delays of up to five days 21 in some reported cases; and 22 23 WHEREAS, second, patient transportation capacity can be a 24 major obstacle; even if a bed or service is available in another 25 facility, a suitable transportation service must also be 26 available, one which can accommodate the specific medical needs 27 of the patient; and 28 29

WHEREAS, currently, only one company, Hawaii Life Flight, 1 offers air ambulance services for neighbor islands, and on Oahu, 2 American Medical Response is the sole private ground ambulance 3 4 and primary provider of inter-facility transport, with Honolulu Emergency Medical Services primarily focused on emergency 911 5 responses; and 6 7 WHEREAS, third, limited bed availability and the ability to 8 provide appropriate care by a receiving hospital must also be 9 addressed; even if a bed is available at a certain facility to 10 receive a patient, the facility must also have the necessary 11 personnel and infrastructure to care for that patient which 12 could include specialized services such as hemodialysis, cardiac 13 catheterization, and provision of ICU level of care, among 14 15 others; and 16 WHEREAS, to develop and evaluate potential solutions to 17 these complex issues will likely require the input, expertise, 18 and collaborative efforts of the many stakeholders involved in 19 providing care to patients throughout the State; now, therefore, 20 21 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the 22 Thirty-second Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular 23 Session of 2024, the Senate concurring, that the Director of 24 Health is requested to convene a working group to address issues 25 relating to the existing system of patient transfer and 26 ambulance services and evaluate potential solutions including: 27 28 Formation of a statewide coordinated transfer system (1)29 to identify available beds, specialized medical 30 services, medical specialist availability, and level 31 of care; 32 33 Increasing transportation capacity for both ground and 34 (2) air transport of patients, including interisland air 35 transport of patients; and 36 37 Increasing bed and specialized medical service 38 (3) availability at accepting hospitals, with a focus on 39 high-need areas such as hemodialysis capacity; and 40 41

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Director of Health invite 1 representatives of the following stakeholders to serve on the 2 working group: 3 4 The emergency services or fire department of each (1)5 county in the State; 6 7 Emergency medical services advisory committee; (2)8 9 Healthcare Association of Hawaii; (3) 10 11 (4) HACEP; 12 13 Hospitals and federally qualified health centers (5) 14 serving both rural and urban populations, including 15 representatives from each county in the State; and 16 17 Transportation service providers including Hawaii Life (6) 18 Flight and American Medical Response; 19 20 provided that the Director of Health may invite other 21 stakeholders as necessary; and 22 23 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the working group is requested 24 to submit a final report to the Legislature, including 25 recommendations and proposed legislation, no later than twenty 26 days prior to the convening of the Regular Session of 2025; and 27 28 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 29 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Director of Health 30 who is in turn requested to transmit a copy to each stakeholder 31 invited to the working group. 32 33 34 35 OFFERED BY:
