

## HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE DIRECTOR OF HEALTH TO CONVENE A WORKING GROUP TO ADDRESS ISSUES RELATING TO PATIENT TRANSFER AND AMBULANCE SERVICES AND EVALUATE POTENTIAL SOLUTIONS.

WHEREAS, patients on Oahu and the neighbor islands are 1 currently experiencing significant delays while waiting for 2 transfer to a facility that can provide a higher level of care; 3 4 and 5 WHEREAS, according to the Hawaii Chapter of the American 6 College of Emergency Physicians (HACEP), these delays have led 7 to serious, sometimes even fatal repercussions for affected 8 patients; and 9 10 WHEREAS, HACEP has conducted a preliminary review of these 11 cases which affirms the critical need to address this issue and 12 has identified three primary issues with the current patient 13 transfer and ambulance system; and 14 15 WHEREAS, first, unless there is a preexisting agreement 16 between two hospitals, if a physician caring for a patient needs 17 specific services not available at the physician's health care 18 facility, the physician must research what is available at other 19 facilities and contact them one by one to determine whether the 20 other facility has the services and bed space to care for the 21 patient, which can lead to significant delays of up to five days 22 in some reported cases; and 23 24 WHEREAS, second, patient transportation capacity can be a 25 major obstacle; even if a bed or service is available in another 26 27 facility, a suitable transportation service must also be available, one which can accommodate the specific medical needs 28 of the patient; and 29 30

WHEREAS, currently, only one company, Hawaii Life Flight, 1 offers air ambulance services for neighbor islands, and on Oahu, 2 American Medical Response is the sole private ground ambulance 3 4 and primary provider of inter-facility transport, with Honolulu 5 Emergency Medical Services primarily focused on emergency 911 6 responses; and 7 8 WHEREAS, third, limited bed availability and the ability to 9 provide appropriate care by a receiving hospital must also be addressed; even if a bed is available at a certain facility to 10 receive a patient, the facility must also have the necessary 11 personnel and infrastructure to care for that patient which 12 13 could include specialized services such as hemodialysis, cardiac catheterization, and provision of an intensive care unit level 14 of care, among others; and 15 16 17 WHEREAS, to develop and evaluate potential solutions to these complex issues will likely require the input, expertise, 18 and collaborative efforts of the many stakeholders involved in 19 20 providing care to patients throughout the State; now, therefore, 21 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the 22 23 Thirty-second Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular 24 Session of 2024, the Senate concurring, that the Director of Health is requested to convene a working group to address issues 25 relating to the existing system of patient transfer and 26 27 ambulance services and evaluate potential solutions including: 28 29 (1) Formation of a statewide coordinated transfer system 30 to identify available beds, specialized medical services, medical specialist availability, and level 31 of care: 32 33 34 (2) Increasing transportation capacity for both ground and 35 air transport of patients, including interisland air transport of patients; and 36 37 (3) Increasing bed and specialized medical service 38 39 availability at accepting hospitals, with a focus on 40 high-need areas such as hemodialysis capacity; and 41 42 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Director of Health invite representatives of the following stakeholders to serve on the 43 44 working group:
