HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

URGING THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH, DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION, AND DEPARTMENT OF LAND AND NATURAL RESOURCES TO TAKE ACTION TO REDUCE THE CARBON EMISSIONS ARISING FROM AIRPLANE TRANSPORTATION TO AND FROM THE STATE.

WHEREAS, the Hawaiian islands are the most remote inhabited
archipelago from any continental land mass, to and from which
air transportation is the only means of rapid travel; and

5 WHEREAS, a Honolulu Civil Beat article written by Stewart 6 Yerton and published on August 27, 2019, states that airplane 7 flights between the State and the western continental United 8 States produced 2.3 million tons of carbon in 2017, while all 9 global flights to or from the State totaled 6.3 million tons of 10 carbon during the same year; and

12 WHEREAS, a presentation at the Hawai'i Tourism Futures 13 Colloquium by University of Hawai'i researcher Andrei Shkvorov 14 added water vapor, particulates, and nitrogen oxides to Yerton's 15 analysis and thus determined that the annual carbon contribution 16 of visitors entering and leaving the State is 24.6 million tons 17 yearly; and

19 WHEREAS, the Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change has 20 calculated that each individual must remain within a yearly 21 "carbon budget" of 2.7 tons, in order to keep human-made global 22 warming below 1.75 degrees Celsius and reach zero net emissions 23 by 2050; and

WHEREAS, a paper written by Tawn Keeney, MD, and published in October 2020 in the Climate Emergency Digest, an online journal, found that the average round-trip flight to the State creates 1.8 tons of carbon emissions, which is two thirds of a person's 2.7-ton annual carbon budget; and



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1 WHEREAS, multiple possibilities exist to address carbon 2 emissions caused by air travel to and from the State, which 3 include but are not limited to offsetting the carbon 4 contributions from visitors, adjusting the number of visitors 5 coming to the State, and requiring airlines operating in the 6 State to use technology which has a lower carbon output; and 7

8 WHEREAS, some governmental action to curb emissions from 9 airplane travel requires legislative instruction, while other 10 governmental action to curb such emissions can be taken by 11 departments and agencies without the need for legislative 12 instruction; now, therefore,

14 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the 15 Thirty-second Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular 16 Session of 2024, the Senate concurring, that the Department of 17 Health, Department of Transportation, and Department of Land and 18 Natural Resources are urged to take action to reduce the carbon 19 emissions arising from airplane transportation to and from the 20 State; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Health, Department of Transportation, and Department of Land and Natural Resources are urged to develop a set of legislative proposals, whether in coordination with each other or independently, and submit this set of proposals to the Legislature and Governor, forty days or more prior to the beginning of the Regular Session of 2025; and

30 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Health, 31 Department of Transportation, and Department of Land and Natural 32 Resources are requested to consult scientific research which has 33 already been published when taking action to reduce emissions 34 and when developing their set of legislative proposals; and 35 36 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this
