

## HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

URGING THE GOVERNOR, DEPARTMENT OF HUMAN SERVICES, AND DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH TO EXPLORE AVENUES TO ENSURE CONTINUED ACCESS TO AFFORDABLE MEDICATIONS FOR THE STATE'S UNDERSERVED POPULATIONS UNDER THE 340B DRUG PRICING PROGRAM AND URGING HAWAII'S CONGRESSIONAL DELEGATION AND RELEVANT FEDERAL AGENCIES TO MONITOR PHARMACEUTICAL COMPANIES AND TAKE APPROPRIATE ACTIONS TO PROTECT THE INTEGRITY OF THE 340B DRUG PRICING PROGRAM.

1 WHEREAS, the federal 340B Drug Pricing Program (340B
2 Program) requires pharmaceutical companies to sell outpatient
3 drugs at discounted prices to covered entities, including
4 certain types of hospitals and federally qualified health
5 centers (FQHCs), for the pharmaceutical companies' medications
6 to be covered by Medicaid; and

8 WHEREAS, more than two thousand six hundred hospitals were 9 participating in the 340B Program as of January 2023; and 10

11 WHEREAS, to be eligible for the 340B Program, hospitals 12 must meet various criteria, which may include treating 13 disproportionate numbers of low-income Medicare and Medicaid 14 patients, as measured by each hospital disproportionate share 15 hospital adjustment percentage; and

WHEREAS, the 340B Program plays a vital role in supporting access to affordable pharmaceuticals for eligible hospitals and FQHCs serving vulnerable populations across the United States; and

22 WHEREAS, the 340B Program enables participating hospitals 23 and FQHCs to stretch scarce federal resources to reach more 24 eligible patients and provide comprehensive health care services 25 to underserved communities; and

1 WHEREAS, it is crucial to safequard the integrity and 2 effectiveness of the 340B Program to ensure continued availability of discounted medications; and 3 4 5 WHEREAS, pharmaceutical companies have a responsibility to support access to affordable medications for all patients, 6 including those served by hospitals and FQHCs participating in 7 8 the 340B Program (340B hospitals and FQHCs), and should refrain 9 from engaging in actions that hinder the ability of eligible 10 hospitals and FQHCs to fulfill their mission of providing highquality care to underserved populations; and 11 12 13 WHEREAS, recent trends indicate that pharmaceutical companies are intentionally undermining the purpose of the 340B 14 15 Program by imposing provisions that restrict the ability of 340B 16 hospitals and FQHCs to utilize contracted pharmacies for the 17 distribution of drugs under the 340B Program (340B drugs); and 18 19 WHEREAS, these restrictions jeopardize the ability of 340B 20 hospitals and FQHCs to effectively serve their patients and create unnecessary barriers to accessing affordable medications; 21 22 now, therefore, 23 24 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the Thirty-second Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular 25 Session of 2024, the Senate concurring, that the Governor, 26 27 Department of Human Services, and Department of Health is urged to explore avenues to collaborate with 340B hospitals and FOHCs, 28 29 community pharmacies, and other stakeholders to ensure the 30 continued accessibility to affordable medications for 31 underserved populations in Hawaii; and 32 33 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Governor, Department of 34 Human Services, and Department of Health is urged to work with 35 pharmaceutical companies to ensure that the companies uphold their commitment to patient access to affordable pharmaceuticals 36 37 by refraining from implementing restrictions that undermine the ability of 340B hospitals and FQHCs to serve their patients and 38 39 communities; and 40 41 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Hawaii congressional 42 delegation and relevant federal agencies are urged to monitor and address any instances of pharmaceutical company actions that 43

restrict access to 340B drugs and to take appropriate



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legislative or regulatory action to protect the integrity of the 1 340B Program; and 2 3 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 4 5 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Governor, Director of the Department of Human Services, Director of the Department 6 of Health, Hawaii's congressional delegation, Administrator of 7 the Health Resources and Services Administration, and the Center 8 for Medicare and Medicaid Services. 9 10

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
