HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH TO CONVENE A HEALTH CARE FACILITIES LABOR STANDARDS WORKING GROUP TO RESEARCH, ASSESS, AND MAKE RECOMMENDATIONS ON THE BEST PRACTICES IN LABOR STANDARDS THAT CAN BE IMPLEMENTED AT HOSPITALS, CARE HOMES, AND DIALYSIS FACILITIES IN THE STATE.

WHEREAS, the State is facing a persistent health care 1 staffing shortage, which has been exacerbated by the challenges 2 posed by COVID-19; and 3 4 WHEREAS, as a result of this ongoing shortage, the staff-5 to-patient ratio has greatly increased, leading to working 6 conditions becoming increasingly unpredictable and unsafe and 7 increasing the rate of burn out by health care professionals; 8 9 and 10 WHEREAS, research has shown that improved staff-to-patient 11 ratios greatly improve patient safety and outcomes; and 12 13 WHEREAS, identifying best practices in labor standards for 14 15 health care facilities will help inform lawmakers on how to improve working conditions for health care professionals and 16 17 increase recruitment and retention; now, therefore, 18 19 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the Thirty-second Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular 20 Session of 2024, the Senate concurring, that the Department of 21 Health is requested to convene a health care facilities labor 22 standards working group to research, assess, and make 23 recommendations on the best practices in labor standards that 24 can be implemented at hospitals, care homes, and dialysis 25 facilities in the State; and 26 27
