

HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF HUMAN SERVICES TO REPORT ON THE CULTURAL AND THERAPEUTIC SERVICES PROVIDED BY COMMUNITY-BASED ORGANIZATIONS AT THE KAWAILOA YOUTH AND FAMILY WELLNESS CENTER.

WHEREAS, homelessness, poverty, and mental health are among 1 the most pressing social issues within the State; and 2 3 WHEREAS, ten percent of Hawaii's homeless population is 4 comprised of individuals under the age of eighteen years; and 5 6 WHEREAS, forty-four percent of homeless youth report having 7 spent time in jail or a juvenile detention center; and 8 9 WHEREAS, "opportunity youth", sometimes referred to as 10 disconnected youth, are between the ages of sixteen and twenty-11 four and are neither in school nor working; and 12 13 WHEREAS, state-sponsored working groups and recent reports 14 have shown that community-based support centers for opportunity 15 youth, or homeless or formerly incarcerated youth, substantially 16 reduce: 17 18 The likelihood that youth are incarcerated; 19 (1)20 21 (2) The amount of time they spend incarcerated; and 22 The likelihood that they experience homelessness; and 23 (3) 24 25 WHEREAS, the Opportunity Youth Action Hawaii hui at the Kawailoa Youth and Family Wellness Center partners with state 26 and nonprofit agencies to transform punitive modalities of 27 treatment and incarceration with effective therapeutic 28 29 community-based programs rooted in indigenous knowledge systems and cultural practices; and 30 31

WHEREAS, expanding state and private sector collaboration 1 and implementing proven and effective therapeutic and cultural 2 methods to promote youth wellness can help the State reduce 3 homelessness and the negative effects of incarceration; now, 4 therefore, 5 6 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the 7 Thirty-second Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular 8 Session of 2024, the Senate concurring, that the Department of 9 Human Services is requested to report on the positive effects of 10 cultural and therapeutic services provided by community-based 11 organizations at the Kawailoa Youth and Family Wellness Center; 12 and 13 14 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the report is requested to 15 include plans for expanding state and private sector 16 17 collaboration to reduce homelessness and the negative effects of incarceration and promote youth wellness; and 18 19 20 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Human Services is requested to submit the report of its findings and 21 recommendations, including any proposed legislation, to the 22 Legislature no later than twenty days prior to the convening of 23 the Regular Session of 2025; and 24 25 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a certified copy of this 26 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Director of Human 27 28 Services. 29 30 OFFERED BY: him horts 31
