HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

URGING EACH COUNTY TO ESTABLISH AN EMERGENCY ZONING CODE FOR POST-DISASTER USE.

1 WHEREAS, following the Maui wildfires in August of 2023, 2 the Speaker of the State House of Representatives established 3 six bipartisan interim working groups tasked with evaluating 4 specific topics in the aftermath of the wildfires and making 5 recommendations for appropriate legislative action in the 6 Regular Session of 2024; and 7

8 WHEREAS, members of the working groups collaborated with 9 federal, state, and county agencies, along with community 10 stakeholders and interested parties, to identify immediate 11 issues that require temporary or transitional relief for the 12 people and businesses of West Maui; and 13

14 WHEREAS, the Shelter Working Group was specifically tasked 15 with evaluating the availability and creation of temporary and 16 transitional shelters for displaced individuals and families and 17 preparing recommendations for appropriate legislative action; 18 and

20 WHEREAS, the State was already suffering from high housing 21 costs due to low supply levels, and the Maui wildfires 22 exacerbated the already severe housing crisis; and

24 WHEREAS, the Maui wildfires reportedly damaged 3,631 25 properties, a majority of which were rental housing and housing 26 for low-income families; and 27

28 WHEREAS, numerous private individuals have set up temporary 29 housing on private land, with much of the temporary housing 30 going on agricultural lands; however, no county has established 31 an emergency zoning code that would allow the siting of

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1 temporary shelters, such as trailers, recreational vehicles, and 2 prefab housing; and 3 4 WHEREAS, disasters can occur anywhere and at any time and 5 it is imperative that the State is prepared to address the aftereffects of any future disaster and utilize all tools 6 available to ensure that residents have a clean and safe place 7 8 to reside during trying times; now, therefore, 9 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the 10 Thirty-second Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular 11 Session of 2024, the Senate concurring, that each county is 12 urged to establish an emergency zoning code that would allow for 13 the siting of temporary shelters such as trailers, recreational 14 vehicles, and prefab housing to be used immediately following a 15 16 disaster; and 17 18 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 19 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Mayor of the County of Hawaii, Mayor of the City and County of Honolulu, Mayor of 20 the County of Kauai, Mayor of the County of Maui, each member of 21 the Hawaii County Council, each member of the Honolulu City 22 23 Council, each member of the Kauai County Council, and each member of the Maui County Council. 24 25 26 (Sem mus 27
