## HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE CURRENT MEMBERS OF THE NORTHWEST WILDLAND FIRE PROTECTION AGREEMENT TO AMEND THE AGREEMENT TO ALLOW HAWAII TO JOIN AS A MEMBER.

WHEREAS, following the Maui wildfires in August 2023, the 1 Speaker of the House of Representatives established six 2 bipartisan interim working groups tasked with evaluating 3 specific topics in the aftermath of the wildfires and making 4 recommendations for appropriate legislative action in the 5 Regular Session of 2024; and 6 7 8 WHEREAS, members of the working groups collaborated with federal, state, and county agencies, along with community 9 stakeholders and interested parties, to identify immediate 10 issues that require temporary or transitional relief for the 11 people and businesses of West Maui; and 12 13 14 WHEREAS, the Wildfire Prevention Working Group was specifically tasked with identifying the causes of wildfires and 15 preventative action that may be taken to reduce the risk of 16 wildfires throughout the State; and 17 18 19 WHEREAS, the State is facing a growing wildfire crisis 20 exacerbated by the mounting impacts of climate change; and 21 22 WHEREAS, the annual area burned by wildfires in the State has increased three hundred percent between 1904 and 2022; and 23 24 25 WHEREAS, every year, about 0.50 percent of the State's total land area burns, which is greater than the proportion of 26 land area burned across the entire United States mainland; and 27 28

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WHEREAS, despite this situation, Hawaii spends less than 1 other states on wildfire prevention and response, budgeting an 2 annual average of \$3,200,000 over the past decade; and 3 4 WHEREAS, to promote the effective prevention, 5 pre-suppression, and control of forest fires in the Northwest 6 wildland region of the United States and adjacent areas of 7 Canada, the United States Congress enacted the Northwest 8 Wildland Fire Protection Agreement (Agreement) under Public Law 9 105-377; and 10 11 12 WHEREAS, this Agreement allows members to request aid from other members in controlling or preventing wildland fires; and 13 14 15 WHEREAS, the Agreement provides a way for member states, provinces, and territories to cope with wildland fires that 16 might be beyond the capabilities of a single member agency, 17 through information, technology, and resources sharing 18 activities; and 19 20 WHEREAS, the members of the Agreement develop procedures 21 that will facilitate and coordinate the sharing of information, 22 technology, and resources in order to mitigate and manage the 23 effect of wildland fires in a safe, effective, and efficient 24 manner through the compact area of responsibility; and 25 26 WHEREAS, however, membership to this Agreement is limited 27 to Alaska, Idaho, Montana, Oregon, Washington, the Yukon 28 29 Territory, the Province of British Columbia, and the Province of Alberta, including any other state, province, or territory that 30 31 is contiguous to any member; and 32 33 WHEREAS, while membership is limited to certain geographical constraints, the State has much to benefit from the 34 Agreement to prevent a tragedy similar to the Maui wildfires 35 form reoccurring; now, therefore, 36 37 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the 38 Thirty-second Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular 39 Session of 2024, the Senate concurring, that the current members 40 41 of the Northwest Wildland Fire Protection Agreement (Agreement)

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1 under Public Law 105-377 are requested to amend the Agreement to 2 allow Hawaii to join as a member; and 3 4 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this

5 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Governors of the
6 states of Alaska, Idaho, Montana, Oregon, and Washington;
7 Lieutenant Governors of the provinces of British Columbia,
8 Alberta, and Saskatchewan; and Commissioners of the Yukon and
9 Northwest Territories.
