## HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF HUMAN SERVICES TO ESTABLISH A WORKING GROUP TO ADDRESS ISSUES RELATING TO REIMBURSEMENTS AND PAYMENTS TO HOME AND COMMUNITY-BASED SERVICES PROVIDERS.

WHEREAS, home and community-based services providers carry
 out essential and necessary services to the State's elderly and
 vulnerable populations; and

5 WHEREAS, a 2022 study conducted by the actuarial firm 6 Milliman of reimbursement rates for home and community-based 7 services found that, for all provider types, current median 8 direct care wages paid by the service providers fell below the 9 United States Bureau of Labor Statistics twenty-fifth percentile 10 for those occupations; and

12 WHEREAS, adequate reimbursements and payments are crucial 13 to sustain and improve the quality of care provided by home and 14 community-based residential care home facilities; and 15

16 WHEREAS, there is a pressing need to identify and implement 17 measure to enhance reimbursement rates for all home and 18 community-based services providers; now, therefore, 19

BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the Thirty-second Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2024, the Senate concurring, that the Department of Human Services is requested to establish a working group to address issues relating to reimbursements and payments to home and community-based services providers; and
