

HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

RECOGNIZING THE ISSUE OF ILLEGAL DUMPING WITHIN THE WAIPAHU COMMUNITY AND URGING THE STATE, CITY AND COUNTY OF HONOLULU, AND MILITARY TO WORK TOGETHER TO ADDRESS THIS CONCERN.

WHEREAS, the act of illegal dumping poses significant, 1 environmental risks to the State's communities; and 2 3 WHEREAS, illegal dumping in Waipahu threatens public health 4 and safety by contaminating soil, water sources, and roads; and 5 6 WHEREAS, illegal dumping has led to a hazardous environment 7 that affects Waipahu's natural habitat and residents in the 8 surrounding area; and 9 10 WHEREAS, illegal dumping has resulted in diminished pride 11 for cleanliness throughout the Waipahu community; and 12 13 14 WHEREAS, bike paths in Waipahu and the surrounding areas are particularly affected by acts of illegal dumping; and 15 16 WHEREAS, neighboring residents may not fully acknowledge 17 the same values to care for the Waipahu community, which is 18 creating an unhealthy environment for future generations; and 19 20 WHEREAS, urgent action is necessary to mitigate health 21 22 risks, protect the environment, and ensure the well-being of Waipahu residents and visitors; now, therefore, 23 24 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the 25 Thirty-second Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular 26 27 Session of 2024, the Senate concurring, that this body recognizes the issue of illegal dumping within the Waipahu 28 29 community; and
