HOUSE RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF LABOR AND INDUSTRIAL RELATIONS AND WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT COUNCIL TO ESTABLISH A TASK FORCE TO CONDUCT A COMPREHENSIVE STUDY OF THE STATE'S CURRENT EDUCATION AND WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT PROGRAMS.

WHEREAS, unlike other states, such as New York and 1 California, Hawaii lacks adequate advocacy from the executive 2 branch for workforce development; and 3 4 WHEREAS, tourism and retail, the State's most dominant 5 economic sectors, provide relatively low wages for workers, most 6 of whom are of Pacific Islander, Native Hawaiian, and Filipino 7 8 heritage; and 9 WHEREAS, work-based learning and development programs allow 10 youth and adults to explore new opportunities, build skills, and 11 transition into new career pathways; and 12 13 14 WHEREAS, providing workforce development and work-based learning programs to train low wage workers for higher wage 15 sectors will improve their economic status and reduce the racial 16 wealth gap; now, therefore, 17 18 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the 19 Thirty-second Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular 20 Session of 2024, that the Department of Labor and Industrial 21 Relations and the Workforce Development Council is requested to 22 23 establish a task force to conduct a comprehensive study of the State's current education and workforce development programs; 24 25 and 26 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Workforce Development 27 Council is requested to select the members of the task force; 28 29 and 30 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the task force is requested to: 31 32
