### HOUSE RESOLUTION

URGING THE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION TO ENSURE THAT EACH PUBLIC SCHOOL AND PUBLIC CHARTER SCHOOL IN THE STATE, FROM KINDERGARTEN THROUGH GRADE TWELVE HAS A CERTAIN NUMBER OF MENTAL HEALTH PROFESSIONALS.

WHEREAS, the State is experiencing an acute mental health 1 crisis among children and youth; and 2 3 4 WHEREAS, school psychologists provide direct and indirect 5 support to evaluate and address students' intellectual 6 development, academic success, social-emotional learning, and 7 mental and behavioral health; and 8 9 WHEREAS, school counselors counsel students and parents, evaluate students' abilities, address learning problems, and 10 assist students in career and personal development; and 11 12 -13 WHEREAS, school psychologists and school counselors are 14 crucial to supporting the mental health and well-being of 15 students in school; and 16 WHEREAS, the National Association of School Psychologists 17 recommends a ratio of one psychologist to five hundred students; 18 19 and  $\mathbf{20}$ 21 WHEREAS, the American School Counselor Association recommends a ratio of one school counselor to two hundred fifty 22 23 students; and 24 25 WHEREAS, the public schools and public charter schools in the State presently do not meet the recommendations by the 26 27 National Association of School Psychologists; and 28 29 WHEREAS, ensuring adequate staffing levels of mental health professionals consistent with recommended ratios will provide 30 31 Hawaii's keiki with critical support needed to address the ongoing mental health crisis; now, therefore, 32 33
