HOUSE RESOLUTION

URGING THE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION TO ENSURE THAT EACH PUBLIC SCHOOL AND PUBLIC CHARTER SCHOOL IN THE STATE, FROM KINDERGARTEN THROUGH GRADE TWELVE, HAS A CERTAIN NUMBER OF MENTAL HEALTH PROFESSIONALS.

1	WHEREAS, the State is experiencing an acute mental health
2	crisis among children and youth; and
3	
4	WHEREAS, school psychologists provide direct and indirect
5	support to evaluate and address students' intellectual
6	development, academic success, social-emotional learning, and
7 8	mental and behavioral health; and
8 9	WUEDENS school councelers councel students and remarks
9 10	WHEREAS, school counselors counsel students and parents, evaluate students' abilities, address learning problems, and
11	assist students in career and personal development; and
12	abbibt beauenes in career and personar development, and
13	WHEREAS, school psychologists and school counselors are
14	crucial to supporting the mental health and well-being of
15	students in school; and

17	WHEREAS, the National Association of School Psychologists
18	recommends a ratio of one psychologist to five hundred students;
19	and
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21 22	WHEREAS, the American School Counselor Association
22	recommends a ratio of one school counselor to two hundred fifty students; and
24	Students, and
25	WHEREAS, public schools and public charter schools in the
26	State presently do not meet the recommendations by the National
27	Association of School Psychologists; and

29	WHEREAS, ensuring adequate staffing levels of mental health
30	professionals consistent with recommended ratios will provide

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1 Hawaii's keiki with critical support needed to address the 2 ongoing mental health crisis; now, therefore, 3 4 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the 5 Thirty-second Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular 6 Session of 2024, that the Department of Education is urged to ensure that each public school and public charter school in the 7 8 State, from kindergarten through grade twelve, employs, or retains under contract, at least one mental health professional 9 10 for every two hundred fifty students enrolled; provided that if 11 a public school has fewer than two hundred fifty students 12 enrolled, the school is urged to employ or retain under a contract at least one mental health professional; and 13 14 15 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that "mental health professional" under this concurrent resolution means: 16 17 18 (1)A licensed mental health counselor, as defined in 19 section 453D-1, Hawaii Revised Statutes; 20 21 (2) A psychologist licensed to practice psychology under 22 chapter 465, Hawaii Revised Statutes; 23 24 (3) A person employed as a school psychologist pursuant to section 465-3(a)(3), Hawaii Revised Statutes; 25 26 (4) A social worker, as defined in section 467E-1, Hawaii 27 Revised Statutes; or 28 29 (5)30 A social worker exempt from licensure pursuant to 31 section 467E-6(2), Hawaii Revised Statutes; and 32 33 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Education is 34 requested to cooperate with other state agencies, as 35 appropriate, to ensure adequate staffing levels of mental health professionals in public schools and public charter schools; and 36 37 38 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Education is 39 requested to submit a report to the Legislature no later than twenty days prior to the convening of the Regular Session of 40 2025, detailing the progress made toward meeting the benchmark 41

of each public school and public charter school in the State,

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1 from kindergarten through grade twelve, employing or retaining 2 under contract, the number of mental health professionals set 3 forth in this concurrent resolution; and 4 5 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 6 Resolution be transmitted to the Chairperson of the Board of

7 Education; Superintendent of Education; and Executive Director 8 of the State Public Charter School Commission.
