## HOUSE RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH TO CONVENE A HEALTH CARE FACILITIES LABOR STANDARDS WORKING GROUP TO RESEARCH, ASSESS, AND MAKE RECOMMENDATIONS ON THE BEST PRACTICES IN LABOR STANDARDS THAT CAN BE IMPLEMENTED AT HOSPITALS, CARE HOMES, AND DIALYSIS FACILITIES IN THE STATE.

WHEREAS, the State is facing a persistent health care 1 staffing shortage, which has been exacerbated by the challenges 2 posed by COVID-19; and 3 4 WHEREAS, as a result of this ongoing shortage, the staff-5 to-patient ratio has greatly increased, leading to working 6 conditions becoming increasingly unpredictable and unsafe and 7 increasing the rate of burn out by health care professionals; 8 and 9 10 11 WHEREAS, research has shown that improved staff-to-patient 12 ratios greatly improve patient safety and outcomes; and 13 14 WHEREAS, identifying best practices in labor standards for health care facilities will help inform lawmakers on how to 15 improve working conditions for health care professionals and 16 increase recruitment and retention; now, therefore, 17 18 19 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the Thirty-second Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular 20 Session of 2024, that the Department of Health is requested to 21 22 convene a health care facilities labor standards working group to research, assess, and make recommendations on the best 23 24 practices in labor standards that can be implemented at hospitals, care homes, and dialysis facilities in the State; and 25 26 27 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the working group is requested 28 to research, assess, and make recommendations on: 29
